Education – Maryland Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention <u>Awareness</u> Act

FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, in collaboration with certain entities, to develop certain policies and to implement a certain program to provide awareness to certain coaches, school personnel, students, and parents or guardians of students on the risk of sudden cardiac arrest; requiring a county board of education to provide certain information and a certain notice to a certain student and parent or guardian; requiring a student and parent or guardian to sign a certain statement; requiring the Department to create a certain information sheet and acknowledgment statement; authorizing the Department to use certain materials; authorizing a public school to hold certain informational meetings; requiring the removal from play of certain students or youth athletes under certain circumstances; prohibiting the return to play of certain students or youth athletes under certain circumstances until a certain condition is met; requiring certain coaches to attend a certain training course; requiring a county board, or a third party, to provide certain information to certain individuals; requiring certain individuals to acknowledge receipt of certain information in a certain manner; requiring certain youth sports programs to provide certain statements of intent to comply to certain county boards of education or their agents; encouraging certain youth programs to follow certain guidelines; requiring a youth sports program to make certain information on sudden cardiac arrest available to certain coaches, youth athletes, and the parents or guardians of youth athletes; requiring a local
