3 FOR the purpose of establishing the State Early Childhood Advisory Council; 4 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Council; prohibiting a 5 member of the Council from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 6 reimbursement of certain expenses; providing for the purposes of the Council; 7 requiring the Council to hold certain meetings at least a certain number of 8 times per year and to maintain minutes of meetings; authorizing the Council to 9 adopt certain procedures and bylaws; providing for the automatic resignation of 10 a Council member, subject to a certain waiver, under certain circumstances; 11 requiring the Council to take certain actions, including developing a strategic 12 plan to improve the school readiness skills of young children and generally providing an infrastructure of continuous program improvement for the State's 13 early learning and development programs; requiring the Council to provide a 14 15 certain statewide strategic report to the Governor and the General Assembly on 16 or before a certain date; requiring the Council to meet periodically after a 17 certain report is submitted to review implementation of the report's recommendations and any changes in State and local need; defining a certain 18 term; and generally relating to the State Early Childhood Advisory Council. 19
