A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Speed Monitoring and Work Zone Speed Control Systems –**
3 **Repeal**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing the authority of counties and municipalities in the State
5 to use speed monitoring systems to enforce certain highway speed laws;
6 repealing the authority to use work zone speed control systems to enforce
7 certain highway speed laws within work zones; requiring the publishers of the
8 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of
9 the Department of Legislative Services, to correct any references throughout the
10 Code that are rendered incorrect by this Act and to describe any corrections in
11 an editor's note following the section affected; and generally relating to the
12 repeal of provisions of law authorizing the use of speed monitoring and work
13 zone speed control systems.

16 Section 21–809 and 21–810
17 Annotated Code of Maryland

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 21–809 and 21–810 of Article – Transportation of the
21 Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publishers of the
23 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the
24 Department of Legislative Services, shall correct any references throughout the
25 Annotated Code that are rendered incorrect by this Act, with no further action
