Environmentally Preferable Procurement – Maryland Green Purchasing Committee

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Maryland Green Purchasing $\mathbf{5}$ Committee; requiring the Committee to develop and publish specifications for 6 adoption by State units that will enable implementation of environmentally 7preferable purchasing; requiring State units to adopt certain environmentally 8 preferable purchasing specifications; altering the requirement for the reporting 9 of recycled content materials by State units; defining a certain term; altering a 10 certain definition; making technical changes; repealing obsolete provisions; and generally relating to the procurement and use of environmentally preferable 11 12products and practices.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 [(f)] (D) On or before September 1 of each year, each State unit shall report 15 to the [Department of the Environment] DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES on 16 the unit's procurement of [recycled materials] ENVIRONMENTALLY PREFERABLE 17 PRODUCTS AND SERVICES AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE UNIT'S GROSS PURCHASES 18 during the preceding fiscal year, including the types and quantities of [materials] 19 PRODUCTS AND SERVICES procured [and the percentage of recycled materials in the 20 unit's gross purchases].

[(g)] (E) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, this section is broadly applicable to all procurements by the State if the quality of the product OR SERVICE is consistent with the requirements of the bid specifications.

24 (2) Only to the extent necessary to prevent the denial of federal 25 moneys or eliminate the inconsistency with federal law, this section does not apply to 26 a procurement by the State if the procurement officer determines that compliance with 27 this section would:

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(i) cause denial of federal moneys; or
