1 REGULATED FIREARM THROUGH THE STATE TO ANOTHER STATE WHERE THE 2 PERSON IS NOT PROHIBITED FROM POSSESSING A REGULATED FIREARM.

3 (B) A REGULATED FIREARM BEING TRANSPORTED THROUGH THE 4 STATE BY A PERSON WHO IS NOT A RESIDENT OF THE STATE MAY NOT BE:

5 (1) LOADED WITH AMMUNITION; AND

6 (2) READILY OR DIRECTLY ACCESSIBLE FROM THE PASSENGER 7 COMPARTMENT OF THE TRANSPORTING VEHICLE.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2014.
