A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore County – Education – Report on Low-Achieving Students**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Baltimore County Superintendent of Schools to
4 submit a certain report on the number of students in certain grades for each
5 Baltimore County public school with less than a certain grade point average and
6 the programs that have been established to reduce the number of students with
7 a low grade point average to the Baltimore County Board of Education, the
8 Baltimore County Council, and the Baltimore County Delegation of the General
9 Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act;
10 and generally relating to education and low-achieving students in Baltimore
11 County.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That:

14 On or before December 1, 2014, the Baltimore County Superintendent of
15 Schools shall submit a report to the Baltimore County Board of Education, the
16 Baltimore County Council, and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government
17 Article, the Baltimore County Delegation of the General Assembly, on:

18 (1) the number of students in grades 9 through 12 for each Baltimore
19 County public school for the past 3 school years with less than a 2.0 unweighted grade
20 point average; and

21 (2) the programs that have been established in Baltimore County to
22 reduce the number of students in public schools with less than a 2.0 unweighted grade
23 point average.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
25 June 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31,

1 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
2 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
