A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning
Highways - Scenic Byways - Signs
FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Highway Administration to issue a permit for a certain sign along or near a certain scenic byway if the sign was erected on or before a certain date; and generally relating to signs erected along scenic byways.
BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Transportation Section 8–730 Annotated Code of Maryland (2008 Replacement Volume and 2013 Supplement)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article - Transportation
8–730.
(A) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE Administration may not issue a permit for any outdoor sign along or near any federal—aid primary highway, if the sign:
(1) Imitates or resembles any official traffic sign, signal, or device;
(2) Is erected or maintained on any tree or painted or drawn on any rock or other natural feature;
(3) Is erected or maintained in a way that:

3 4	(ii) Obstructs or interferes with a driver's view of approaching merging, or intersecting traffic;
5 6	(4) Is located within 250 feet of any public park, public forest playground, or cemetery that is adjacent to a federal-aid primary highway; or
7 8	(5) Is along or near a scenic byway located on the federal—aid primary highway.
9 10 11	(B) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY ISSUE A PERMIT FOR AN OUTDOOR SIGN ALONG OR NEAR A SCENIC BYWAY LOCATED ON A FEDERAL-AID PRIMARY HIGHWAY IF THE SIGN WAS ERECTED ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2008.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
