A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Department of Veterans Affairs – Opioids Time Lock Dispenser Pilot**
3 **Program**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a certain
5 opioids time lock dispenser pilot program; requiring the Secretary to adopt
6 certain regulations to implement the pilot program; authorizing the regulations
7 to include any other provisions necessary to carry out the pilot program;
8 prohibiting the regulations from requiring a veteran to pay a fee in order to get
9 a time lock dispenser; requiring the Secretary annually to submit a report to the
10 Governor and the General Assembly on the progress of the pilot program;
11 defining a certain term; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally
12 relating to the opioids time lock dispenser pilot program.

14 Article – State Government

15 Section 9–949 to be under the new part “Part VII. Opioids Time Lock Dispenser
16 Pilot Program”

20 WHEREAS, The number of prescriptions for narcotics given to veterans has
21 dramatically increased; and

1 WHEREAS, Prescription drug abuse also has dramatically increased among
2 veterans; and

3 WHEREAS, Veterans die of accidental overdoses at a higher rate than
4 nonveterans; now, therefore,

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 **Article – State Government**

8 **9–947. RESERVED.**

9 **9–948. RESERVED.**

10 **PART VII. OPIOIDS TIME LOCK DISPENSER PILOT PROGRAM.**

11 **9–949.**

12 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, “TIME LOCK DISPENSER” MEANS A DEVICE THAT**
13 **IS PROGRAMMED TO DISPENSE MEDICATION ON A SCHEDULE.**

14 **(B) THE SECRETARY SHALL ESTABLISH A 3–YEAR OPIOIDS TIME LOCK**
15 **DISPENSER PILOT PROGRAM UNDER WHICH THE DEPARTMENT:**

16 **(1) PROVIDES TIME LOCK DISPENSERS TO VETERANS IN THE**
17 **STATE WHO ARE PRESCRIBED OPIOIDS; AND**

18 **(2) STUDIES THE EFFECT OF THE USE OF THE TIME LOCK**
19 **DISPENSERS ON THE RATE OF VETERANS IN THE STATE WHO OVERDOSE ON**
20 **OPIOIDS.**

21 **(C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE**
22 **SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE PILOT PROGRAM**
23 **REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDING REGULATIONS**
24 **THAT:**

25 **(I) ESTABLISH THE QUALIFICATIONS A VETERAN SHALL**
26 **HAVE TO RECEIVE A TIME LOCK DISPENSER; AND**

27 **(II) REQUIRE A VETERAN TO RETURN A TIME LOCK**
28 **DISPENSER.**

1 **(2) THE REGULATIONS MAY INCLUDE ANY OTHER PROVISIONS**
2 **NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PILOT PROGRAM.**

3 **(3) THE REGULATIONS MAY NOT REQUIRE A VETERAN TO PAY A**
4 **FEE TO RECEIVE A TIME LOCK DISPENSER.**

5 **(D) THE SECRETARY ANNUALLY SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE**
6 **GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THIS ARTICLE, THE**
7 **GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PROGRESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM REQUIRED**
8 **UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.**

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 October 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of
11 September 30, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
12 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
