AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 24July 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 252015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. 26
