A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study Expanding Metrorail Service in Southern Prince George's County

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Expanding Metrorail Service $\mathbf{5}$ in Southern Prince George's County; providing for the membership, chair, and 6 staffing of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to consider certain 7 transportation-related issues and make recommendations relating to expanding 8 Metrorail service in certain areas of southern Prince George's County; requiring 9 the Task Force to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating 10 to the Task Force to Study Expanding Metrorail Service in Southern Prince 11 12George's County.
- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- (a) There is a Task Force to Study Expanding Metrorail Service in Southern
 Prince George's County.
- 17 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 18 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the19 President of the Senate;
- 20 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker 21 of the House;
- (3) the Maryland Secretary of Transportation, or the Secretary'sdesignee;

12 13	(9) one representative of the South County Economic Development Association, Inc., in Prince George's County;

16 17 18	(11) three residents of Prince George's County, at least one of whom regularly commutes for work or other purposes to Washington, D.C., or to the inner suburbs of Washington, D.C.
19 20	(c) At its first meeting, the Task Force shall elect a chair from among the Task Force members.
21	(d) A member of the Task Force:
22	(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but
$\begin{array}{c} 23\\ 24 \end{array}$	(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
25	(e) The Task Force shall:
$26 \\ 27 \\ 28$	(1) study the rail transit needs of southern Prince George's County in the MD 201/I–295 corridor, in particular in the National Harbor area and points south to Indian Head, Maryland;
29 30	(2) identify and evaluate potential rights-of-way for stations and other infrastructure that would be needed to expand Metrorail service in southern

31 Prince George's County in the designated MD 201/I–295 corridor;

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(3) estimate the cost of expanding Metrorail service in southern Prince
 George's County in the designated MD 201/I-295 corridor;
 (4) estimate the economic impact on Prince George's County, the

3 (4) estimate the economic impact on Prince George's County, the 4 State, and the Washington metropolitan region of expanding Metrorail service in 5 southern Prince George's County in the designated MD 201/I–295 corridor; and

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- (5) study and make recommendations regarding:

7 (i) the amount of funding needed to support expanding 8 Metrorail service in southern Prince George's County in the designated MD 201/I–295 9 corridor; and

10 (ii) potential funding sources and mechanisms to support 11 expanding Metrorail service in southern Prince George's County in the designated MD 12 201/I–295 corridor.

13 (f) The Task Force may:

14 (1) conduct site visits to view rail transportation systems in Maryland 15 and in other jurisdictions; and

16 (2) hold public hearings and solicit input from interested persons,17 including:

(i) the county and municipal governing bodies in southern
Prince George's County in the designated MD 201/I-295 corridor;

20 (ii) citizens from throughout the Washington, D.C., 21 metropolitan region who utilize Metrorail or other transit service or who otherwise are 22 interested in the availability of mass transit service; and

23 (iii) other members of the public.

(g) The Maryland Department of Transportation and the Prince George's
 County Department of Public Works and Transportation shall provide staff support for
 the Task Force.

(h) The Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the
Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the General
Assembly on or before December 1, 2014.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 June 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 32 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 33 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
