## Changing the Name of the Washington, D.C., Professional Football Team

FOR the purpose of urging the owners of the Washington, D.C., professional football franchise to change the name of the football team.

WHEREAS, The Washington, D.C., professional football team has had a proud and storied heritage in the Washington metropolitan area since 1937, bringing tens of millions of friends, families, and communities together for more than 7 decades; and

WHEREAS, The term "redskins" has been associated with gruesome acts of genocide, is disparaging to those of Native American heritage, and is not befitting a professional football team with such a proud, honorable, and uplifting tradition, especially a team representing the nation's capital and playing in Maryland, a State grounded in respect for the dignity of all individuals; and

WHEREAS, The unifying force of pride for our Washington, D.C., professional football team should not be undermined by the divisive nature of its name; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That, out of respect for the diverse heritage of this nation, the Washington metropolitan area, and the team's passionate fans, the Maryland General Assembly urges the owners of the Washington, D.C., professional football franchise to change the name of the football team to a name that is not offensive to Native Americans or any other group; and be it further
