CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Alcoholic Beverages - Brewing Company Off-Site Permit

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Office of the Comptroller to issue a brewing 4 company off-site permit to certain persons that meet certain requirements; 5 requiring the Office to collect a fee for a brewing company off-site permit; 6 authorizing a brewing company off-site permit holder to provide and sell a 7 certain amount of beer for certain purposes under certain circumstances; 8 requiring a brewing company off-site permit holder to have a certain agent 9 present while selling beer or providing samples at a farmers' market; specifying 10 certain events at which a brewing company off-site permit may be used; 11 specifying the term of a brewing company off-site permit; requiring an 12 applicant for a brewing company off-site permit to submit a certain application 13 form developed by the Office and pay a certain fee to obtain a permit; requiring 14 a brewing company off-site permit holder to notify the Office within a certain period of time of the permit holder's intention to attend an off-site event; 15 authorizing the Office to adopt regulations to require a brewing company 16 17 off-site permit holder to notify a certain board of license commissioners of the 18 permit holder's intention to attend an off-site event; and generally relating to 19 brewing company off-site permits.
