CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Commission on Department of Disabilities – Study of Accessibility Concepts in Computer Science, Information Systems, and Information Technology Programs in Higher Education

FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Accessibility Concepts in Computer Science, Information Systems, and Information Technology Programs in Higher Education; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission: prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission requiring the Department of Disabilities, in cooperation with the National Federation of the Blind, to study and make recommendations regarding eertain matters accessibility concepts in computer science, information systems, and information technology programs in higher education; requiring the Commission Department to submit a preliminary report and a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or before certain dates; providing for the termination of this Act; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Commission on Accessibility Concepts in Computer Science, Information Systems, and Information Technology Programs in Higher Education study of accessibility concepts in computer science, information systems, and information technology programs in higher education.
