A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Economic Development – Commission on Maryland's Future

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Maryland's Future; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of 4 $\mathbf{5}$ the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 6 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the chair of the Commission to 7call the first meeting on or before a certain date; authorizing the chair to call 8 certain additional meetings; requiring the Commission to hold certain public 9 hearings; requiring the Commission to study and make recommendations 10 regarding certain matters; requiring the Commission to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain 11 date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 12Commission on Maryland's Future. 13

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That:

- 16 (a) There is a Commission on Maryland's Future.
- 17 (b) The Commission consists of the following members:
- 18 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the19 President of the Senate;
- 20 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker 21 of the House;
- (3) the Secretary of Business and Economic Development, or the
 Secretary's designee;

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the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, or the 1 (4) $\mathbf{2}$ Secretary's designee; and 3 the following members, appointed by the Governor: (5)4 (i) two members of organized labor unions; $\mathbf{5}$ (ii) two members representing industry, including one 6 representing large industry and one representing small industry, at least one of whom 7 represents a manufacturing concern; 8 (iii) one representative of a military installation located in the 9 State: one representative of an educational institution; 10 (iv) 11 (v) one representative of an environmental organization; 12(vi) one representative of a community organization concerned with defense transitions: 13 14one representative of a veterans' group; (vii) 15(viii) one representative of an organization that provides nongovernmental support to the unemployed and underemployed; 16 17(ix) one representative of a minority population in the State that is especially likely to experience high unemployment; 18 one representative of a nonprofit organization that is 19(x) 20specifically involved with economic matters in the State; and 21(xi) one representative who has a national reputation in defense 22diversification, specifically related to reindustrialization and sustainable economic development. 2324The Governor shall designate the chair of the Commission. (c) 25The Department of Legislative Services shall provide staff for the (d) 26Commission. 27(e) A member of the Commission: 28(1)may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but

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1 (2)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard $\mathbf{2}$ State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 3 (f) (1)The chair of the Commission shall call the first meeting of the Commission on or before June 30, 2014. 4 $\mathbf{5}$ (2)The chair of the Commission may call additional meetings of the 6 Commission as necessary. 7 The Commission shall: (g) 8 (1)hold at least three public hearings, each of which shall include a 9 3-month public comment period following the hearing; and 10 study and develop recommendations to address the economic (2)renewal of Maryland, specifically focusing on adjustment strategies to address a draw 11 12down in federal defense, particularly those strategies noted as especially effective by 13the Office of Economic Adjustment of the United States Department of Defense, 14including: building local capacity and a commitment to change by 15(i) 16 engaging key stakeholders, including both unionized and nonunionized workers, in community transitions related to defense draw downs; 1718 developing strategies that support multiple economic drivers (ii) 19to replace lost defense jobs, especially in the environmental, green energy, and 20disaster resilience areas; and assisting smaller firms and subcontractors that may have a 21(iiii) 22strong interest in pursuing new markets or diversification opportunities. 23On or before June 1, 2015, the Commission shall report its findings and (h)24recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State 25Government Article, the General Assembly. 26SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27June 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 1 month and, at the 28end of June 30, 2016, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this 29Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
