9	(c) The annual license fee is \$200.
10 11	(d) (1) Applications for a BWST license shall be made on forms supplied by the Board of License Commissioners.
12 13	(2) Renewals of the license may be made at the time the regular license is renewed.
14	(3) A license may be granted without a hearing.
15 16	(4) If application for a license is denied, the applicant may request a public hearing before the Board.
17 18	(e) (1) A holder of a BWST license may allow consumption by a single individual for sampling or tasting purposes of:
19	(i) Not more than 1 ounce of a given brand of light wine; and
20	(ii) Not more than 3 ounces of a given brand of beer.
21	[(2) A maximum of six bottles of wine may be opened at any one time.]
22 23	(2) The bottles of wine that may be opened at any one time at a wine sampling or tasting event are:

7	(f) (1) A BWST license is for on-premises consumption only.
8 9	(2) Sampling or tasting of beer or wine may not be conducted from a drive-through window.
10 11	(G) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
