## Department of Planning - Maryland Unaccompanied Homeless Youth and Young Adult Count Demonstration Project

FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Unaccompanied Homeless Youth and Young Adult Count Demonstration Project; requiring the Department of <del>Planning</del> Housing and Community Development to select and monitor a coordinating entity to oversee the Maryland Unaccompanied Homeless Youth and Young Adult Count Demonstration Project; establishing the purpose of the Project: requiring the coordinating entity to be selected through a competitive request for proposal or by sole source contract; requiring the coordinating entity to determine the number and characteristics of unaccompanied homeless youth and young adults in certain jurisdictions Continuums of Care using certain methods; requiring the coordinating entity to assign each youth participant a unique identifier; requiring the Department of Planning to provide certain technical assistance; requiring the <del>Department</del> Departments to make every effort to identify non-State sources of funding to fund the cost of the Project; providing for the termination of this Act; requiring the coordinating entity to submit a certain report on or before a certain date; making this Act subject to a certain contingency; and generally relating to the Maryland Unaccompanied Homeless Youth and Young Adult Count Demonstration Project.
