A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City – Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2014**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for
4 Baltimore City to waive a certain food requirement for a restaurant owned and
5 operated by a not–for–profit organization in a certain area of the City;
6 authorizing the Board to waive certain restrictions on license transfers in
7 certain areas under certain circumstances; requiring the Board or its designee
8 to examine each application for the issuance or transfer of a license within a
9 certain time; specifying requirements to be met before an application for the
10 issuance, transfer, or renewal of a license may be considered complete;
11 specifying certain requirements to be met before a certain hearing; providing
12 procedures for making changes to an application; requiring the Board to digitize
13 and post online certain records by a certain date and adopt certain regulations;
14 requiring that certain revenue be payable to the director of finance; requiring
15 the Board to submit a budget request to the City annually in a certain form and
16 to provide certain other material to the City; requiring the Board to ensure that
17 each fee or fine that the Board imposes and collects is prominently listed on the
18 Web site of the Board; requiring the Mayor and City Council to pay, from the
19 general fund of the City that includes revenue from the Board, the salaries and
20 expenses of the Board and its employees and devote the balance of the revenue
21 from the Board to the general purposes of the City; requiring the Board
22 annually to establish performance measures for certain activities; requiring the
23 Board to make the performance measures available to the public on a certain
24 Web site; requiring that on request, the Board submit certain reports to the
25 Office of Legislative Audits; providing for certain salaries and benefits for
26 members of the Board; requiring the Board to employ an executive secretary
27 and deputy executive secretary based on certain criteria; repealing certain
28 restrictions concerning the removal of the executive secretary and deputy
29 executive secretary; prohibiting a member or employee of the Board from having
30 certain financial interests or soliciting or receiving certain items from certain
31 persons; requiring a member of the Board to resign under certain

1 circumstances; requiring, under certain circumstances, a member of the Board
2 to certify to the City Board of Elections that the individual is no longer a
3 member of the Board; specifying that the Board or its designee performs certain
4 tasks, including reviewing the zoning of licenses; requiring a certain period for
5 public comment before the Board may adopt a regulation; requiring the Board
6 to review its regulations at a certain time for a certain purpose; repealing the
7 requirement that the Board employ and set salaries for certain part-time
8 inspectors; requiring the Board to employ certain individuals; providing for the
9 salary of the position of attorney; specifying that certain employees of the Board
10 are in the classified civil service of the City; requiring that, to the extent
11 possible, all employees of the Board be residents of the City; requiring the Board
12 to provide to the director of finance certain information; requiring the Board to
13 determine the salaries of the employees of the Board under certain
14 circumstances; specifying that the Board may consider an employee's
15 performance and experience in determining the appropriate salary level;
16 repealing a certain pay schedule for certain employees of the Board; specifying
17 that the Board consists of a certain number of regular and alternate members;
18 providing for the qualifications, term, and appointment of the members;
19 defining certain terms; altering a certain definition; making certain stylistic
20 changes; making this Act an emergency measure; providing for the effective
21 date of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to alcoholic
22 beverages and the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

4 1–102.

5 (a) (1) In this article the following words have the meanings indicated.

6 (22) (i) 1. “Restaurant” means an establishment:

7 A. Which accommodates the public;

8 B. Which is equipped with a dining room with facilities
9 for preparing and serving regular meals; and

10 C. In which the average daily receipts from the sale of
11 foods exceed the average daily receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages.

12 2. However the board of license commissioners in any
13 county by regulation may prescribe a different standard as to what constitutes a
14 restaurant.

15 3. **[For] SUBJECT TO SUBSUBPARAGRAPH 4 OF THIS**
16 **SUBPARAGRAPH, FOR** a restaurant in Baltimore City, the average daily receipts from
17 the sale of food must be at least 40% of the total daily receipts of the establishment.

18 **4. THE BOARD OF LIQUOR LICENSE**
19 **COMMISSIONERS FOR BALTIMORE CITY MAY WAIVE THE FOOD REQUIREMENT**
20 **SPECIFIED UNDER SUBSUBPARAGRAPH 3 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH FOR A**
21 **RESTAURANT OWNED AND OPERATED BY A NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION IN**
22 **THE AREA BOUNDED BY SOUTH ELLWOOD AVENUE ON THE WEST, BANK**
23 **STREET ON THE NORTH, SOUTH BOULDIN STREET ON THE EAST, AND FLEET**
24 **STREET ON THE SOUTH.**

26 (a) (1) Except as **OTHERWISE** provided in [paragraph (2) of this
27 subsection] **THIS SECTION**, in Baltimore City, no new license, or removal of an
28 existing license, shall be granted to sell alcoholic beverages in any building located
29 within 300 feet of the nearest point of the buildings of a church or school, but the
30 license of any person now holding a license for any building located within such
31 distance of the building grounds of a church or school may be renewed or extended for
32 the same building.

1 (2) In the 45th Legislative District in Baltimore City, a new Class A
2 license of any type may not be issued for the sale of alcoholic beverages in a building
3 located within 500 feet of the nearest point of the building of a place of worship or
4 school.

5 (b) The restrictions regarding distance in subsection (a)(1) of this section do
6 not apply to the following licenses, which may be issued within the 300 feet limitation:

7 (1) Except in the 46th Legislative District, Class B beer and wine;

8 (2) Except in the 46th Legislative District, Class B beer, wine and
9 liquor;

10 (3) Class C beer and wine; and

11 (4) Class C beer, wine and liquor.

12 (c) Except in the 46th Legislative District, the governing body of any church
13 in writing may waive the restrictions of this section regarding licenses not specified in
14 subsection (b) with respect to cafes or restaurants located within 250 feet of a theater
15 having a capacity of not less than 300 seats, which theater is operated by a nonprofit
16 theater association.

17 **(D) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO AN AREA BOUNDED BY:**

18 **(I) HIGH STREET ON THE WEST, FAWN STREET ON THE**
19 **NORTH, CENTRAL AVENUE ON THE EAST, AND EASTERN AVENUE ON THE**
20 **SOUTH; OR**

21 **(II) WEST CROSS STREET ON THE WEST, CLIFFORD STREET**
22 **ON THE NORTH, SCOTT STREET ON THE EAST, AND CARROLL STREET ON THE**
23 **SOUTH.**

24 **(2) THE BOARD OF LIQUOR LICENSE COMMISSIONERS FOR**
25 **BALTIMORE CITY MAY WAIVE THE RESTRICTIONS OF THIS SECTION REGARDING**
26 **DISTANCE IN SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF THIS SECTION FOR AN APPLICATION FOR A**
27 **LICENSE TRANSFER INTO AN AREA SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS**
28 **SUBSECTION IF:**

29 **(I) THE APPLICATION IS APPROVED BY:**

30 **1. EACH COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION REPRESENTING**
31 **THE AREA;**

32 **2. EACH BUSINESS ASSOCIATION IN THE AREA; AND**

1 **3. THE PASTOR AND CHURCH BOARD OF DIRECTORS**
2 **OR PASTORAL COUNCIL FOR EACH CHURCH WITHIN 300 FEET OF THE**
3 **PROPOSED LOCATION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT FOR WHICH THE LICENSE**
4 **TRANSFER IS SOUGHT; AND**

5 **(II) A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING IS EXECUTED BY**
6 **THE APPLICANT FOR THE LICENSE TRANSFER AND EACH COMMUNITY**
7 **ASSOCIATION IN THE AREA.**

9 (a) **(4) (I) THIS PARAGRAPH APPLIES ONLY IN BALTIMORE CITY.**

10 **(II) IN THIS PARAGRAPH, "BOARD" MEANS THE BOARD OF**
11 **LIQUOR LICENSE COMMISSIONERS.**

12 **(III) THE BOARD OR THE BOARD'S DESIGNEE SHALL**
13 **EXAMINE EACH APPLICATION FOR THE ISSUANCE OR TRANSFER OF A LICENSE**
14 **WITHIN 45 DAYS OF RECEIPT OF THE APPLICATION TO DETERMINE WHETHER**
15 **THE APPLICATION IS COMPLETE.**

16 **(IV) AN APPLICATION FOR THE ISSUANCE, TRANSFER, OR**
17 **RENEWAL IS NOT COMPLETE UNLESS THE APPLICANT HAS:**

18 **1. OBTAINED ZONING APPROVAL OR VERIFICATION**
19 **OF ZONING IF THE APPLICATION IS FOR RENEWAL;**

20 **2. SUBMITTED ALL DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN THE**
21 **APPLICATION; AND**

22 **3. PAID ALL FINES AND FEES THAT ARE DUE.**

23 **(V) 1. A LICENSE HEARING MAY NOT BE SCHEDULED**
24 **UNLESS THE BOARD DETERMINES THAT THE APPLICATION IS COMPLETE.**

25 **2. A COMPLETE APPLICATION WITH ALL SUBMITTED**
26 **DOCUMENTS SHALL BE POSTED ONLINE AT LEAST 14 DAYS BEFORE THE**
27 **HEARING DATE.**

28 **(VI) THE POSTPONEMENT OF A HEARING SHALL BE POSTED**
29 **ONLINE NOT LESS THAN 72 HOURS BEFORE THE HEARING DATE.**

1 **(VII) 1. TO INCORPORATE A CHANGE IN THE**
2 **APPLICATION DOCUMENT AFTER THE BOARD OR THE BOARD'S DESIGNEE HAS**
3 **DETERMINED THE APPLICATION TO BE COMPLETE, THE APPLICANT SHALL**
4 **SUBMIT THE CHANGE TO THE BOARD NOT LATER THAN 15 DAYS BEFORE THE**
5 **SCHEDULED HEARING.**

6 **2. AN APPLICANT MAY OFFER A LATER CHANGE TO**
7 **THE APPLICATION ON THE RECORD AT THE HEARING.**

8 **3. AFTER THE HEARING ON THE APPLICATION, AN**
9 **APPLICANT MAY CHANGE THE APPLICATION ONLY AT A NEW HEARING.**

10 **(VIII) THE BOARD SHALL:**

11 **1. STARTING ON JULY 1, 2015, DIGITIZE AND POST**
12 **ONLINE ALL RECORDS FOR PUBLIC REVIEW; AND**

13 **2. ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS**
14 **SUBPARAGRAPH.**

15 **(IX) THE BOARD SHALL IMPOSE A FINE THAT IT**
16 **DETERMINES FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS**
17 **PARAGRAPH.**

19 **(d) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "BOARD" MEANS THE BOARD OF**
20 **LIQUOR LICENSE COMMISSIONERS OF BALTIMORE CITY.**

21 **(2) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IN BALTIMORE CITY.**

22 **(3) THE REVENUE FROM LICENSE FEES, PERMIT FEES, FINES,**
23 **AND ADVERTISING FEES SHALL BE PAYABLE TO THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE.**

24 **(4) THE BOARD SHALL:**

25 **(i) SUBMIT A BUDGET REQUEST TO BALTIMORE CITY**
26 **ANNUALLY IN THE FORM THAT THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REQUIRES; AND**

27 **(ii) PROVIDE ADDITIONAL BUDGET JUSTIFICATION**
28 **MATERIAL THAT THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REQUESTS.**

1 **(5) THE BOARD SHALL ENSURE THAT EACH FEE OR FINE THAT**
2 **THE BOARD IMPOSES AND COLLECTS IS PROMINENTLY LISTED ON THE WEB**
3 **SITE OF THE BOARD.**

4 **(6) [In Baltimore City the] THE Mayor and City Council of**
5 **Baltimore shall [pay]:**

6 **(I) PAY from the [receipts] GENERAL FUND OF BALTIMORE**
7 **CITY THAT INCLUDES REVENUE FROM THE BOARD, the salaries and EXPENSES of**
8 **the Board [of License Commissioners of Baltimore City] and its employees[, as**
9 **approved by the State Comptroller]; AND**

10 **(II) DEVOTE THE BALANCE OF THE REVENUE FROM THE**
11 **BOARD TO THE GENERAL PURPOSES OF THE CITY.**

12 **(7) (I) THE BOARD ANNUALLY SHALL ESTABLISH**
13 **PERFORMANCE MEASURES USING THE CITISTAT PROGRAM OF THE CITY OF**
14 **BALTIMORE FOR SUCH ACTIVITIES AS:**

15 1. **FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT;**

16 2. **ISSUANCE OF LICENSES; AND**

17 3. **ENFORCEMENT OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LAWS.**

18 **(II) THE BOARD SHALL MAKE THE PERFORMANCE**
19 **MEASURES AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC ON THE OPEN BALTIMORE WEB SITE.**

20 **(8) ON REQUEST, THE BOARD SHALL SUBMIT TO THE OFFICE OF**
21 **LEGISLATIVE AUDITS PERFORMANCE ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS TO ENSURE**
22 **THAT THE BOARD IS ON TRACK TO MEET ITS ANNUAL PERFORMANCE**
23 **MEASURES.**

25 (d) In Baltimore City:

26 (1) **(I) The chairman AND EACH OTHER REGULAR MEMBER of**
27 **the Board shall receive an annual salary [of] THAT:**

28 1. **IS NOT LESS THAN \$28,500[, and the other members**
29 **of the Board shall receive an annual salary of \$28,000];**

30 2. **IS SET IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES; AND**

1 **3. INCLUDES ANY COST OF LIVING INCREASE**
2 **AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL.**

3 **(II) THE ALTERNATE MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL**
4 **RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY OF \$16,000.**

5 (2) The chairman and the other members of the Board **EXCEPT THE**
6 **ALTERNATE MEMBER** are eligible to receive the same health benefits that full-time
7 [liquor inspectors] **EMPLOYEES** of the Board receive.

8 (3) The Board shall [appoint] **EMPLOY** an executive secretary and a
9 deputy executive secretary whose salaries shall be fixed by the Board[, subject to
10 approval by the State Comptroller].

11 (4) The executive secretary and the deputy executive secretary shall
12 be residents of Baltimore City and of high character and integrity.

13 (5) The executive secretary and the deputy executive secretary shall
14 be [appointed] **EMPLOYED** upon the basis of their executive skill and [ability and once
15 appointed shall hold office during good behavior regardless of changes in members
16 constituting the Board. They shall be removed only for incompetency or immorality
17 upon charges furnished in writing by the Board setting forth the grounds for dismissal
18 and after opportunity for hearing] **EXPERIENCE.**

19 (6) Either the executive secretary or the deputy executive secretary
20 shall be a member of the Bar of this State.

22 (d) (1) This subsection applies only in Baltimore City.

23 (2) A [commissioner] **MEMBER** or employee of the Board:

24 (i) May not have any [interest,] direct or indirect[, either
25 proprietary or by means of any loan, mortgage or lien, or in any other manner,]
26 **INTEREST** in or on any premises where alcoholic beverages are manufactured,
27 distributed, or sold **WHETHER THE INTEREST IS:**

28 **1. PROPRIETARY;**

29 **2. HELD BY MEANS OF A LOAN, MORTGAGE, OR LIEN;**

1 **3. BENEFICIALLY OWNED THROUGH AN**
2 **INVESTMENT VEHICLE, ESTATE, TRUST, OR OTHER INTERMEDIARY WHEN THE**
3 **BENEFICIARY DOES NOT CONTROL THE INTERMEDIARY OR MAY SUPERVISE OR**
4 **PARTICIPATE IN THE INTERMEDIARY'S INVESTMENT DECISIONS; OR**

5 **4. HELD IN ANY OTHER MANNER;**

6 (ii) May not have any interest, direct or indirect, in any
7 business wholly or partially devoted to the manufacture, distribution, or sale of
8 alcoholic beverages;

9 (iii) May not own any stock in any corporation which has any
10 interest, proprietary or otherwise, direct or indirect, in any premises where alcoholic
11 beverages are manufactured, distributed, or sold or in any business wholly or partially
12 devoted to the manufacture, distribution, or sale of alcoholic beverages; [or]

13 (iv) May not receive any salary or other compensation or any
14 other thing of value from a business engaged in the manufacture, distribution, or sale
15 of alcoholic beverages;

16 **(V) MAY NOT SOLICIT OR RECEIVE DIRECTLY OR**
17 **INDIRECTLY OR ON BEHALF OF ANOTHER PERSON, A COMMISSION, POLITICAL**
18 **CONTRIBUTION, REMUNERATION OR GIFT, FROM:**

19 **1. A PERSON WHO IS ENGAGED IN THE**
20 **MANUFACTURE, DISTRIBUTION, OR SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; OR**

21 **2. AN AGENT OR EMPLOYEE OF A PERSON WHO IS**
22 **ENGAGED IN THE MANUFACTURE, DISTRIBUTION, OR SALE OF ALCOHOLIC**
23 **BEVERAGES; AND**

24 **(VI) SHALL COMPLY WITH BALTIMORE CITY PUBLIC ETHICS**
25 **LAWS AND FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE PROVISIONS ENACTED BY THE MAYOR AND**
26 **CITY COUNCIL.**

27 (3) [An employee of the Board may not hold any other federal, State,
28 or local public office or employment.

29 (4) A [commissioner] MEMBER OR AN EMPLOYEE of the Board may
30 hold any other public office or employment, federal, State or local, unless that public
31 office or employment would pose a conflict of interest.

32 **(4) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD WHO APPLIES FOR GOVERNMENT**
33 **EMPLOYMENT THAT WOULD POSE A CONFLICT OF INTEREST AS DETERMINED BY**

1 THE BALTIMORE CITY BOARD OF ETHICS SHALL RESIGN FROM THE BOARD BY
2 A LETTER ADDRESSED TO THE GOVERNOR.

3 (5) (I) ON FILING A CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY FOR
4 ELECTION TO A PUBLIC OFFICE OR WITHIN 30 DAYS BEFORE THE FILING
5 DEADLINE FOR THE PRIMARY ELECTION FOR THE PUBLIC OFFICE SOUGHT,
6 WHICHEVER OCCURS LATER, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD
7 OR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE BOARD SHALL CERTIFY TO THE CITY BOARD OF
8 ELECTIONS UNDER OATH THAT THE INDIVIDUAL IS NO LONGER A MEMBER OF
9 THE BOARD.

10 (II) THE CERTIFICATION SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED BY A
11 LETTER ADDRESSED TO THE GOVERNOR CONTAINING THE RESIGNATION OF
12 THE MEMBER OF THE BOARD.

13 [(5)] (6) (i) Every employee of the Board:

14 1. Shall devote that employee's whole time and attention
15 to the business of the Board during the hours designated by the Board for the
16 performance of official duties;

17 2. May not engage in any occupation, business or
18 profession in any way connected or associated, directly or indirectly, with the
19 manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages; and

20 3. May not transact business of any kind whatsoever
21 beyond his or her official duties with any licensee, or in connection with the operation
22 of any establishment licensed for the manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages.

23 (ii) Any employee of the Board who violates any of the
24 provisions of this subsection shall be removed.

25 [(6)] (7) (i) As to any entity licensed under the provisions of this
26 article, a [commissioner] MEMBER or AN employee of the Board may not solicit or
27 receive directly or indirectly any commission, remuneration or gift whatsoever from
28 any:

29 1. Person or corporation engaged in the manufacture or
30 sale of beer or other alcoholic beverages;

31 2. Agent or employee of that person or corporation; or

32 3. Licensee licensed under the provisions of this article.

1 (ii) A person or corporation engaged in the manufacture or sale
 2 of beer or other alcoholic beverages, any agent or employee of that person or
 3 corporation, and a licensee licensed under the provisions of this article may not, either
 4 directly or indirectly, offer to pay any commission, profit or remuneration or make any
 5 gift to any [commissioner] MEMBER or employee of the Board or to anyone on behalf
 6 of that [commissioner] MEMBER or employee of the Board.

7 [(7)] (8) The [chairman of the] Board[:

8 (i) Is its administrative officer and is charged with the duty of
 9 enforcing] OR THE BOARD'S DESIGNEE GOVERNS, ADMINISTERS, AND ENFORCES
 10 the provisions of this article[;] IN BALTIMORE CITY, INCLUDING PERFORMING
 11 SUCH TASKS AS:

12 [(ii)] (I) [Shall personally supervise] SUPERVISING the
 13 activities and investigations of the several inspectors and other employees of the
 14 Board;

15 [(iii)] (II) [Shall examine] EXAMINING the location and general
 16 character of the licensees in the City; [and]

17 (III) REVIEWING THE ZONING OF LICENSES DURING THE
 18 LICENSE APPLICATION, LICENSE TRANSFER, AND LICENSE RENEWAL
 19 PROCESSES; AND

20 (iv) [Shall make recommendations to the Board] ADOPTING
 21 REGULATIONS concerning zoning of licensees[, AND methods of enforcement[, and
 22 promulgation of regulations] to carry out the purposes AND ENFORCEMENT of this
 23 article.

24 [(8)] (9) (I) BEFORE THE BOARD MAY ADOPT A REGULATION:

25 1. THE BOARD SHALL PROVIDE A PERIOD OF AT
 26 LEAST 30 DAYS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT; AND

27 2. THE CITY SOLICITOR SHALL REVIEW THE
 28 REGULATIONS TO ENSURE THAT THE REGULATIONS COMPLY WITH THE
 29 AUTHORITY GRANTED TO THE BOARD BY THE STATE.

30 (II) Regulations adopted by the Board shall be published and
 31 distributed to whichever licensees are affected by them.

1 **(III)** The Board may require any licensee to display prominently
 2 in the licensee's place of business any regulation of the Board, or any excerpt or
 3 statement from this article.

4 **(IV) THE BOARD SHALL REVIEW ITS REGULATIONS ON OR**
 5 **BEFORE OCTOBER 31, 2015, AND AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 5 YEARS THEREAFTER,**
 6 **TO ENSURE THAT THE REGULATIONS COMPLY WITH:**
