Criminal Law - Drug Paraphernalia Near School Property - Penalties

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from committing a certain crime relating to the delivery or sale of drug paraphernalia in a certain school vehicle or in, on, or within a certain distance from certain school—related real property used for elementary or secondary education; establishing a certain penalty; making certain stylistic and conforming changes; and generally relating to the unlawful delivery or sale of drug paraphernalia near school property.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 Article – Criminal Law

- 23 (d) (1) Unless authorized under this title, a person may not deliver or sell,
- or manufacture or possess with intent to deliver or sell, drug paraphernalia, knowing,



- or under circumstances where one reasonably should know, that the drug paraphernalia will be used to:
- 3 (i) plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, 4 compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, 5 contain, or conceal a controlled dangerous substance; or
- 6 (ii) inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled dangerous substance.
- 8 (2) A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor 9 and on conviction is subject to:
- 10 (i) for a first violation, a fine not exceeding \$500; and
- 11 (ii) for each subsequent violation, imprisonment not exceeding 2 years or a fine not exceeding \$2,000 or both.
- 13 (3) A person who is convicted of violating this subsection for the first 14 time and who previously has been convicted of violating paragraph (4) of this 15 subsection is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 2 years or a fine not exceeding 16 \$2,000 or both.
- 17 (4) If a person who is at least 18 years old violates paragraph (1) of 18 this subsection by delivering drug paraphernalia to a minor who is at least 3 years 19 younger than the person, the person is guilty of a separate misdemeanor and on 20 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 8 years or a fine not exceeding 21 \$15,000 or both.

- 23 (a) A person may not manufacture, distribute, dispense, or possess with 24 intent to distribute a controlled dangerous substance in violation of § 5–602 of this 25 subtitle or conspire to commit any of these crimes:
- 26 (1) in a school vehicle, as defined under $\S 11-154$ of the 27 Transportation Article; or
- 28 (2) in, on, or within 1,000 feet of real property owned by or leased to 29 an elementary school, A secondary school, or A county board and used for elementary 30 or secondary education.

26 27	(4) A sentence imposed under paragraph (1) OR (3) of this subsection shall be consecutive to any other sentence imposed.

- [(d)] **(E)** Notwithstanding any other law, a conviction under this section may not merge with a conviction under § 5–602, § 5–603, § 5–604, § 5–605, § 5–606, § 5–607, § 5–608, § 5–609, § 5–612, § 5–613, **§ 5–619,** or § 5–628 of this subtitle.
- 31 **[(e)] (F)** (1) In a prosecution under this section, a map or certified copy 32 of a map made by a county or municipal unit to depict the location and boundaries of
- 33 the area within 1,000 feet of real property owned by or leased to an elementary school,

- secondary school, or county board and used for school purposes is admissible as prima facie evidence of the location and boundaries of the depicted area, if the governing body of the county or municipal corporation approves the map or certified copy of the map as an official record of the location and boundaries of the depicted area.
- 5 (2) The map or a certified copy of the map shall be filed with the county or municipal corporation, which shall maintain the map or the certified copy of the map as an official record.
- 8 (3) The governing body of the county or municipal corporation may 9 revise periodically the map or certified copy of the map.
- 10 (4) This subsection does not preclude the prosecution from introducing other evidence to establish an element of a crime under this section.
- 12 (5) This subsection does not preclude the use or admissibility of maps or diagrams other than those approved by the county or municipal corporation.
