BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 7–804 Annotated Code of Maryland (2008 Replacement Volume and 2013 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education 7-804. In this section, "school vehicle" has the meaning stated in § 11–154 of the (a) Transportation Article. Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety standards, a school vehicle may be operated for 12 years.
