1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Talbot County – Board of Elections – Membership**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the number of regular members of the Talbot County
4 Board of Elections; requiring the members of the local board to be of certain
5 political parties; requiring that a vacancy on the local board be filled in a certain
6 manner; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to the
7 membership of the Talbot County Board of Elections.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Election Law**

16 2–201.

17 (l) (1) In Allegany County, Baltimore City, Caroline County, Charles
18 County, Frederick County, Harford County, Somerset County, **TALBOT COUNTY**,
19 Washington County, Wicomico County, and Worcester County, the local board consists
20 of five regular members.

1 (2) Three regular members shall be of the majority party, and two
2 regular members shall be of the principal minority party.

3 (3) (i) If a vacancy occurs on the local board, the Governor shall
4 appoint an eligible person from the same political party as the predecessor member to
5 fill the vacancy in accordance with subsection (g) of this section for the remainder of
6 the unexpired term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

7 (ii) An appointment made while the Senate of Maryland is not
8 in session shall be considered temporary until the appointee is confirmed by the
9 Senate.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 June 1, 2015.
