## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Talbot County – Board of Elections – Membership**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the number of regular members of the Talbot County  
4 Board of Elections; requiring the members of the local board to be of certain  
5 political parties; requiring that a vacancy on the local board be filled in a certain  
6 manner; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to the  
7 membership of the Talbot County Board of Elections.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
9 Article – Election Law  
10 Section 2–201(l)  
11 Annotated Code of Maryland  
12 (2010 Replacement Volume and 2013 Supplement)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Election Law**

16 2–201.

17 (l) (1) In Allegany County, Baltimore City, Caroline County, Charles  
18 County, Frederick County, Harford County, Somerset County, **TALBOT COUNTY**,  
19 Washington County, Wicomico County, and Worcester County, the local board consists  
20 of five regular members.

21 (2) Three regular members shall be of the majority party, and two  
22 regular members shall be of the principal minority party.

1                   (3)   (i)    If a vacancy occurs on the local board, the Governor shall  
2   appoint an eligible person from the same political party as the predecessor member to  
3   fill the vacancy in accordance with subsection (g) of this section for the remainder of  
4   the unexpired term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

5                   (ii)   An appointment made while the Senate of Maryland is not  
6   in session shall be considered temporary until the appointee is confirmed by the  
7   Senate.

8                   SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
9   June 1, 2015.
