## **Article – Business Regulation**

- 2 **17–1013.**
- 3 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO ALL JUNK DEALERS AND SCRAP METAL PROCESSORS DOING BUSINESS IN THE STATE, INCLUDING NONRESIDENT JUNK DEALERS AND NONRESIDENT SCRAP METAL PROCESSORS.
  - (B) A JUNK DEALER OR SCRAP METAL PROCESSOR MAY NOT PURCHASE COPPER WIRE FROM WHICH THE INSULATION HAS BEEN BURNED OR STRIPPED.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
