10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)							

For over 75 years, Easter Seals has developed a wide range of programs to serve MD. Our

mission is to provide exceptional services to ensure that all people with disabilities or special needs have equal opportunity to live, learn, work & play in their communities. Built on a strong reputation as an effective collaborator with local leaders, we design & offer intensive services for individuals with disabilities & their caregivers. From Center and home-based locations throughout the State, we provide best practice programs across the life span continuum to all of our clients, (e.g. children, senior, veterans & their families) offering a holistic, person-centered approach. We provide community-based services in the following areas: 1)inclusive early childhood education for children with disabilities & typically developing children (many of whom have another special need, such as a risk of developmental delays due to low economic status), 2) family caregiver respite services, 3) support for wounded warriors, veterans & their families including veterans employment programs & caregiver training, & 4)senior medical day services. Additional services include assistive technology; rehabilitative services; & advocacy.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Conceived and opened as a public private partnership with Montgomery County, State of MD & the federal government, Easter Seals Harry & Jeanette Weinberg Inter-Generational Center (the Center) is, as designed, impacting the challenges of the community and the critical needs of its citizens. It is also internationally recognized for its innovative service delivery model & the excellence of its outcomes. Because of that success & the growth of Easter Seals in meeting these needs, we must renovate to expand capacity & increase security. The 2014 Bond Bill will support the 1st phase of renovation (floor 1 and 3) that will increase the capacity for inclusive early childhood education (CDC), respite & veterans programs while allowing for new security enhancements. Overall the two phase renovation project will expand our CDC capacity from 98 to 159 children. Phase 2 of our renovation, not included in this Bond Bill, is 2nd floor renovation. Our respite program is growing, as is our veterans employment program that saw over 1000 clients last year. Completion of phase 1, with the assistance of the 2014 Bond Bill, will help determine when we will be able to begin phase 2.

28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

The CDC provides inclusive early childhood education to children with disabilities & typically developing (T-D) peers, 6 weeks to 5 years. Our inclusionary environment prepares children for kindergarten readiness, academic success & lifelong learning. Emphasizing both learning & caring, Easter Seals' CDC recognizes & respects individual needs & learning styles, providing an environment where children of all abilities can participate. Classrooms follow an inclusive model of childhood programming, based on research & best practices, demonstrating that children with disabilities benefit most when participating with their T-D peers. Among the unique features of the Center are: (1) The intergenerational program benefits children & seniors by enhancing the socialization/stimulation of both in a uniquely shared site; (2)The Little Warriors program offers children of wounded warriors the opportunity to enroll in the CDC, providing education/care while they focus on their recovery. The program allows children the healing benefit of regular interaction with seniors with disabilities, teaching respect & acceptance that will in turn help the Little Warriors to better adjust & emotionally manage their family's new circumstances; (3) Make the First Five Count Program raises the awareness for support services needed for children with disabilities before the age of five; & (4)The In-Center & Community Respite Program offers children with special needs & their T-D siblings (& Little Warriors) planned educational & social stimulation through group interaction, allowing caregivers a day of respite.

When the Center was designed, we were not providing all of the programs we offer today, including the veterans & homeless veterans employment, & our now expanded respite activities; & we did not have such a waiting list for our CDC. The need is growing. We must provide more direct services to individuals of all ages living with disabilities, & their caregivers. Examples of success last year: 300+ veterans enrolled in workforce programs, over 500 individuals/caregivers being aided by Respite, 315 individuals/parents being provided with support & inclusive early education, & an increase in the number of adult day participants through our short-term program with a local hospital. Our overall adult day services in the Center provided for 212 clients/ caregivers last year. Our clients have consistently included children with Autism & other special needs, T-D children, seniors with Alzheimers disease & other age related disabilities. More recently we have met the community need by providing programs for wounded warriors/veterans & their children/families, local families needing critical respite care, assistive phone technology services for seniors, caregiver training & more. We need to build out & renovate to provide classrooms & office space for direct services (phase 1, this request 1st & 3rd floor renovation & security). Phase 2 (not this request) 2nd floor.
