10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Kappa Alpha Psi Foundation of Metropolitan Baltimores (KFMB) purpose is to improve the quality of life and futures for the disadvantaged communities of Baltimore City. We strive to meet this goal by focusing on community service and implementing initiatives that promote the positive development of youth, especially at-risk African-American males.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Resources are needed to design and conduct a partial renovation of the Kappa Alpha Psi Youth and Community Center (KYCC). Renovated space is needed to accommodate the Benchmark Kappas Youth Leadership Institute and community meetings.

The proposed project will include the design and partial renovation of the 10,000 sq. ft. KYCC. The improvements to the KYCC will ensure that at least 100 Institute participants can be served at one time and community resident meetings and activities of 200 residents at one time. The design process will engage Foundation members, community residents and youth engaged in the Institute. The partial renovation will include the renovation of the basement area, modification to the structures ground, second floor and mezzanine areas to fully support educational and community activities. It is anticipated that renovation improvements will afford office space for Institute staff and volunteers; private interviewing rooms where youth can discuss sensitive issues freely; and a mobile computer lab that will be used for educational skill building and career planning for at-risk youth.

28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

The proposed project will have as its purpose the design and partial renovation of the KYCC located at 1207 Eutaw Place in Baltimore, Maryland. The KYCC is a 10,000 sq. ft. facility and will be used as a community meeting space, the primary location for the operations of the KFMB and the Guide Right/Kappa League Program. The goal will be to ensure the full utilization of the usable square footage to provide educational and youth development services to at least 80 participants in the Benchmark Kappas Youth Leadership Institute and community meetings of 200 residents.

The design process will engage Foundation members, community residents and youth engaged in the Institute. The partial renovation will include the renovation of the basement area, modification to the structures ground, second floor and mezzanine areas to fully support educational and community activities. It is anticipated that renovation improvements will afford office space for Guide Right-Kappa League staff and volunteers; private interviewing rooms where youth can discuss sensitive issues freely; modular walls to allow for flexible educational space and a mobile computer lab that will be used for educational skill building and career planning for at-risk youth.

Ensuring that the physical infrastructure is in place is critical to changing the lives of at-risk youth. The KFMB addresses the State of Maryland's Ready by 21 Action Plan through its youth development initiative, by acting as a youth development intermediary to connect young low-income at-risk Baltimore City males with tutoring, mentoring and support services. In 2010, the organization conducted an in depth analysis of the Baltimore Metropolitan area to ensure that its program would meet the needs of at-risk youth. A major component of the Guide Right-Kappa League strategy is meeting at-risk young males where they are. Intensive follow-up, street and door-to-door outreach and school partnerships have been key to the organizations youth service approach.

Once the renovation is complete, the KFMB will be able to increase its service offerings to youth and the community and promote positive youth outcomes and more effectively engage the Bolton Hill Community. Renovations will provide additional space for community meetings and services to youth. As a result, the KFMB expects at least a 400 percent increase in the number of youth served by the program; 20 prior to construction and 100 young people after. Among the key post renovation opportunities, the KFMB will finalize a partnership with the Dell to develop a mobile computer lab that will be accessible to the young men in Guide Right-Kappa League and the surrounding community.
