10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

SHORE UP! INC. is a private non-profit Community Action Partnership on Maryland's Eastern Shore, that is dedicated to building communities, changing lives, and empowering individuals and families to maintain long-term independence and achieve economic self-sufficiency, through a comprehensive system of services and resources. SHORE UP! INC. is seeking funds that will assist in providing payment for the relocation of the Eastern Head Start Center to a newly constructed addition to Easton Elementary School, W. Edward Dobson Building located at 305 Glenwood Avenue, Easton, Maryland.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

SHORE UP! INC. operates 16 Head Start Centers and 2 Early Head Start Centers on the Eastern Shore, in the following counties: Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico, and Worcester. Head Start is a comprehensive family development program that works with economically disadvantaged children ages 3-5 and their families. The program prepares children for kindergarten by enhancing social and cognitive development through education, health, nutritional and other services. The Head Start Program engages families and their child's learning and works with parents to create strong, economically self-sufficient families. A January 14, 2010 press release from the National Head Start Association refers to "landmark studies that demonstrate the significant educational and health gains experienced by low-income children served by Head Start." The release states, "Those long-term studies found that Head Start has decreased criminal activity, child mortality rates, high school dropout rates, the need for special education, the need for children to repeat grades later on in school and increased child achievement-test scores, high school graduation rates, and immunization rates."

28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

Easton Head Start Center was located at 31 Jowite Street in Easton, MD. The building was a renovated funeral home. Despite our best efforts to create an appropriate environment we found that the space was too small and was not conducive to early childhood education and family activities. In short, the Easton Head Start Center needed to be relocated. This addition provides the space and the type of facility that the Easton Head Start Center needs in order to best serve preschool aged children and their families. Additionally, being located on the campus of Easton Elementary School provides program participants access to a variety of resources provided by Talbot County Public Schools (i.e. library, meeting and the parent activity space, cafeteria, gymnasium, adequate outdoor space). Activities to support the successful Head Start program will be enhanced through this collaboration as well.

To accomplish this goal, SHORE UP! INC. in partnership with Talbot County Public Schools and Talbot County Government has created this opportunity for the relocation of the center. The cost of the project is \$2,103,433. Acting as sub-recipient under the jurisdiction of Talbot County, SHORE UP! INC. has received \$800,000 in the form of a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to assist in building an addition to Easton Elementary School, W. Edward Dobson Building, in Easton, Maryland. This project has also received \$344,000 from the School Construction program. The remaining funding of the project was secured through a long term loan with a bank and other sources to leverage the grant in the amount of \$959,433. Thus, SHORE UP! INC. is requesting funding consideration of the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee and the House Committee on Appropriations to assist in offsetting the loan.
