10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Jewish Council for the Aging of Greater Washington, Inc. (JCA) helps older adults in the National Capital Area to maintain their independence, dignity, vitality and self-respect. It also helps people of different generations to understand, learn from and care for one another. JCA accomplishes its work through a myriad of community-based programs built upon vibrant programmatic partnerships with funders, fellow charities and local communities; and by providing opportunities for volunteers to make the region a great place to age. JCA is a recognized leader in meeting the needs of seniors and caregivers of all faiths, ethnicities and walks of life. The philanthropy served more than 31,000 older adults and family caregivers during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Bronfman Center at 12320 Parklawn Drive, Rockville is home to 19 local charities including the Jewish Council for the Aging, the Nonprofit Village and the Village's network of Montgomery County-based service organizations that include the Chinese American Senior Services Association, the Montgomery Coalition for Adult English Literacy and Girls on the Run. The Center is a vibrant place, brimming with senior services, volunteer training programs and community meetings, yet the 50-year-old heating and cooling systems that serve its first (main) floor have far exceeded their life expectancy. Despite JCA spending nearly \$30,000 a year on HVAC maintenance and repairs, downtime is increasing and many of the philanthropy's frail and vulnerable clients cannot handle the temperatures swings. The windows, manufactured decades ago, compound the problem. They provide such scant insulation that much of whatever air is warmed or cooled easily escapes the building, wasting energy, increasing costs and adding to the discomfort of those inside. Thus, JCA asks State of Maryland for help in improving the Bronfman Center's energy efficiency, comfort and safety by providing half of the total projected capital expense.
