10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)							
HART for Animals, Inc. is a nonprofit animal welfare organization founded in 2003. Initially, HART's work consisted of rescuing adoptable animals from the county shelter and transporting							

HART's work consisted of rescuing adoptable animals from the county shelter and transporting them to larger rescue groups. Since 2003, HART has rescued 6,000 animals. In 2009, HART opened its low-cost spay/neuter clinic in Garrett County and, to date, has sterilized 4,500 animals.

In 2007, HART began its capital campaign to raise funds to build an animal adoption center. HART raised \$700,000 and obtained a loan of \$1.7M from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, under its Community Facility Program. Construction of the first section began in June 2013 and will be concluded in February 2014. HART's objective has been to ensure the sustainability of the HART Animal Center by creating revenue-producing businesses and using their profit to support the charitable shelter and adoption functions. The businesses are a veterinary full-service clinic, a boarding kennel, a groomer, and a retail space. HART is requesting this grant to finish the last section of the center - which is HART's core objective: the adoption and shelter wing.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The final wing of the HART Animal Center contains the shelter and adoption area. It will provide housing for 60 dogs, 40 cuts and multiple litters of puppies and kittens. The completion of the adoption wing will relieve the overcrowding of the county's Animal Control/Shelter and ensure that no adoptable animals will be euthanized. In addition to relieving the burden on the county's shelter, the Center will provide 50 permanent jobs for local residents at a time when the local economy and economic recovery have been slow to return to the region. Additional benefits include attracting new visitors to the area by providing boarding facilities for their pets as well as affordable spay/ neuter surgeries and veterinary care for low-income residents. This will be accomplished without adding an additional burden to the taxpayers.
