## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Howard County – Appointed Alcoholic Beverage Hearing Board – Compensation**

3 **Ho. Co. 6–15**

4 FOR the purpose of providing that the compensation for the Howard County Appointed  
5 Alcoholic Beverage Hearing Board shall be the amount set by the Howard County  
6 Council; and generally relating to the compensation for the Howard County  
7 Appointed Alcoholic Beverage Hearing Board.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
9 Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages  
10 Section 15–107.1(f)  
11 Annotated Code of Maryland  
12 (2011 Replacement Volume and 2014 Supplement)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

16 15–107.1.

17 (f) (1) The compensation of the Hearing Board members for the performance  
18 of their duties shall be[:

19 (i) For the chairperson, \$55 per meeting attended, not to exceed  
20 \$1,300 in a fiscal year regardless of the number of meetings attended; and

1                   (ii) For other Hearing Board members, \$50 per meeting attended,  
2 not to exceed \$1,200 in a fiscal year regardless of the number of meetings attended] **THE**  
3 **AMOUNT SET BY THE HOWARD COUNTY COUNCIL;** and

4                   (2) The compensation of the Liquor Board members for the performance of  
5 their duties shall be:

6                   (i) For the chairperson, \$55 per meeting attended, not to exceed  
7 \$1,300 in a fiscal year regardless of the number of meetings attended; and

8                   (ii) For other Liquor Board members, \$50 per meeting attended, not  
9 to exceed \$1,200 in a fiscal year regardless of the number of meetings attended.

10           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
11 October 1, 2015.
