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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Workers' Compensation – Heart Disease and Hypertension Presumption – Anne**  
3 **Arundel County Correctional Officers**

4 FOR the purpose of extending the presumption of compensability under the workers'  
5 compensation law to include, subject to certain conditions, Anne Arundel County  
6 correctional officers who suffer from heart disease or hypertension resulting in  
7 partial or total disability or death; requiring Anne Arundel County correctional  
8 officers to submit certain medical disclosures to a certain official; providing that,  
9 subject to a certain limitation, workers' compensation benefits received under this  
10 Act are in addition to certain retirement benefits; altering the definition of "public  
11 safety employee" to include Anne Arundel County correctional officers for the  
12 purposes of determining certain compensation; providing for the application of  
13 certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to compensability of Anne  
14 Arundel County correctional officers under the workers' compensation law.

25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
26 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

27 **Article – Labor and Employment**

2 (b) (1) A paid police officer employed by an airport authority, a county, the  
3 Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, a municipality, or the State,  
4 a deputy sheriff of Montgomery County, or, subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a  
5 deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL**  
6 **OFFICER**, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince  
7 George's County deputy sheriff, Prince George's County correctional officer, or deputy  
8 sheriff of Allegany County is presumed to be suffering from an occupational disease that  
9 was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if:

10 (i) the police officer, deputy sheriff, or correctional officer is  
11 suffering from heart disease or hypertension; and

12 (ii) the heart disease or hypertension results in partial or total  
13 disability or death.

14 (2) (i) A deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL**  
15 **COUNTY CORRECTIONAL OFFICER**, [a] deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery  
16 County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's  
17 County correctional officer is entitled to the presumption under this subsection only to the  
18 extent that the individual suffers from heart disease or hypertension that is more severe  
19 than the individual's heart disease or hypertension condition existing prior to the  
20 individual's employment as a deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL**  
21 **COUNTY CORRECTIONAL OFFICER**, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery  
22 County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's  
23 County correctional officer.

24 (ii) To be eligible for the presumption under this subsection, a deputy  
25 sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL OFFICER**,  
26 [a] deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince  
27 George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer, as a  
28 condition of employment, shall submit to a medical examination to determine any heart  
29 disease or hypertension condition existing prior to the individual's employment as a deputy  
30 sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL OFFICER**,  
31 deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's  
32 County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer.

33 (e) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any paid  
34 firefighter, paid firefighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire  
35 Marshal, paid police officer, paid law enforcement employee of the Department of Natural  
36 Resources, deputy sheriff of Anne Arundel County, **ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY**  
37 **CORRECTIONAL OFFICER**, park police officer or employee of the Maryland-National  
38 Capital Park and Planning Commission, deputy sheriff of Montgomery County, deputy  
39 sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, deputy sheriff of Prince

1 George's County, or Prince George's County correctional officer who is eligible for benefits  
2 under subsection (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this section or the dependents of those individuals  
3 shall receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual or the dependents  
4 of the individual are entitled to receive under the retirement system in which the individual  
5 was a participant at the time of the claim.

6 (2) The benefits received under this title shall be adjusted so that the  
7 weekly total of those benefits and retirement benefits does not exceed the weekly salary  
8 that was paid to the paid law enforcement employee of the Department of Natural  
9 Resources, a park police officer or employee of the Maryland–National Capital Park and  
10 Planning Commission, firefighter, firefighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the  
11 State Fire Marshal, police officer, deputy sheriff, [or] Prince George's County or  
12 Montgomery County correctional officer, **OR ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY CORRECTIONAL**  
13 **OFFICER.**

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read  
15 as follows:

16 **Article – Labor and Employment**

17 9–628.

18 (a) In this section, “public safety employee” means:

19 (1) a firefighter, firefighting instructor, or paramedic employed by:

20 (i) a municipal corporation;

21 (ii) a county;

22 (iii) the State;

23 (iv) the State Airport Authority; or

24 (v) a fire control district;

25 (2) a volunteer firefighter or volunteer ambulance, rescue, or advanced life  
26 support worker who is a covered employee under § 9–234 of this title and who provides  
27 volunteer fire or rescue services to:

28 (i) a municipal corporation;

29 (ii) a county;

30 (iii) the State;

31 (iv) the State Airport Authority; or

- 1 (v) a fire control district;
- 2 (3) a police officer employed by:
- 3 (i) a municipal corporation;
- 4 (ii) a county;
- 5 (iii) the State;
- 6 (iv) the State Airport Authority;
- 7 (v) the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission;
- 8 or
- 9 (vi) the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority;
- 10 (4) a Prince George’s County deputy sheriff or correctional officer;
- 11 (5) a Montgomery County deputy sheriff or correctional officer;
- 12 (6) an Allegany County deputy sheriff;
- 13 (7) a Howard County deputy sheriff, but only when the deputy sheriff is
- 14 performing law enforcement duties expressly requested, defined, and authorized in
- 15 accordance with a written memorandum of understanding executed between the Howard
- 16 County Sheriff and other law enforcement agencies; or
- 17 (8) an Anne Arundel County deputy sheriff **OR CORRECTIONAL OFFICER.**

18 (h) If a public safety employee is awarded compensation for less than 75 weeks,

19 the employer or its insurer shall pay the public safety employee compensation at the rate

20 set for an award of compensation for a period greater than or equal to 75 weeks but less

21 than 250 weeks under § 9–629 of this subtitle.

22 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding the

23 provisions of § 9–503(b)(2) of the Labor and Employment Article, as enacted by Section 1 of

24 this Act, an Anne Arundel County correctional officer who is employed on or before

25 September 30, 2015:

26 (1) As a condition of continued employment shall provide to the Anne

27 Arundel County Sheriff on or before December 31, 2015, a copy of a medical report

28 disclosing and describing any existing heart disease or hypertension from which the

29 correctional officer may be suffering; and

1           (2) Is entitled to the presumption under § 9–503(b) of the Labor and  
2 Employment Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, only to the extent that the  
3 individual suffers from heart disease or hypertension that is more severe than the  
4 individual’s heart disease or hypertension condition existing as of the date of the medical  
5 report provided under item (1) of this section.

6           SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall be  
7 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any  
8 effect on or application to any claims arising from events occurring before the effective date  
9 of this Act.

10           SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
11 October 1, 2015.
