## A BILL ENTITLED

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Office of Cemetery Oversight - State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors - Crematories - Fees

4 FOR the purpose of providing that certain fees, provided for by a certain process established 5 by the Director of the Office of Cemetery Oversight for regulating crematories, apply 6 to certain persons; clarifying that certain regulations be substantively identical 7 except to the extent of certain statutory differences; prohibiting the Director from 8 charging certain fees for registration as a crematory operator or issuance of a permit 9 to operate a crematory; clarifying that a certain process for regulating crematories established by the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors provide for 10 11 registration of crematory operators or issuance of permits for operating crematories; 12 repealing a requirement that a certain process for regulating crematories established 13 by the Board provide for certain fees; prohibiting the Board from charging certain 14 fees for registration as a crematory operator or issuance of a permit to operate a crematory; and generally relating to the Office of Cemetery Oversight, the State 15 16 Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors, crematories, and fees.
