# 2Vehicle Laws - Special Registration Plates and Parking Placards for3Individuals With Disabilities - Licensed Physical Therapists

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a licensed physical therapist to certify certain medical  $\mathbf{5}$ conditions of an applicant for a special disability registration number and special 6 disability registration plates for a certain vehicle; requiring the State Board of 7 Physical Therapy Examiners to be responsible for the development and maintenance 8 of a database system with which the Motor Vehicle Administration can interface and 9 verify licensure; authorizing a licensed physical therapist to certify the existence of 10 certain permanent disabilities for applicants for a certain parking placard; 11 authorizing a licensed physical therapist to certify the existence of a certain 12 temporary disability of an applicant for a temporary parking placard; defining a 13certain term; making conforming changes; repealing certain obsolete provisions; and generally relating to special registration plates and parking placards for individuals 14 with disabilities. 15

26 (a) A person may apply to the Administration for a temporary parking placard on 27 a form provided by the Administration if:

(1) The applicant, a dependent of the applicant, or any individual who
depends on the applicant for transportation has a disability, as described in § 13–616(b)(1)
of this subtitle; and

(2) A licensed physician, licensed physician assistant, licensed
chiropractor, licensed optometrist, [or] licensed podiatrist, OR LICENSED PHYSICAL
THERAPIST, as defined in § 13–616(a) of this subtitle, certifies that the disability is not
permanent but would substantially impair the applicant's mobility or limit or impair the
applicant's ability to walk for at least 3 weeks, and is so severe that the applicant would

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endure a hardship or be subject to risk of injury if the temporary parking placard were
 denied.

3 (b) An application under subsection (a) of this section shall be accompanied by:

4 (1) Proof satisfactory to the Administration that the applicant, the 5 dependent of the applicant, or the individual who depends on the applicant for 6 transportation is a person with a disability under subsection (a) of this section; and

7 (2) The certification of a licensed physician, licensed physician assistant, 8 licensed chiropractor, licensed optometrist, [or] licensed podiatrist, OR LICENSED 9 PHYSICAL THERAPIST that the applicant, the dependent of the applicant, or the individual 10 who depends on the applicant for transportation is disabled, including an estimate of the 11 length of time the disability will continue.

12 (c) (1) A temporary parking placard for a person with a disability issued under 13 this section shall be valid for a period of time the licensed physician, licensed physician 14 assistant, licensed chiropractor, licensed optometrist, [or] licensed podiatrist, OR 15 LICENSED PHYSICAL THERAPIST has determined that the applicant, the dependent of 16 the applicant, or the individual who depends on the applicant for transportation is likely to 17 have the disability, not to exceed 6 months.

18 (2) The person to whom a temporary parking placard was issued under this 19 section shall return the placard to the Administration within 5 calendar days of the 20 placard's expiration.
