Preamble

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- WHEREAS, Community colleges offer the most affordable form of higher education in the State; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Community colleges are currently limited to awarding 2—year associates 4 degrees; and
- WHEREAS, To make bachelor's degrees affordable to more citizens of the State, the College of Southern Maryland should have the option of offering 4-year bachelor's degree programs that include online courses to students to accomplish that goal; now, therefore,
- 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 9 That Section(s) 16–610 of Article – Education of the Annotated Code of Maryland be 10 renumbered to be Section(s) 16–611.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 14 10-210.
- 15 (b) **(1)** The community colleges of the State shall:
- 16 **[**(1)**] (I)** Provide a core curriculum of general education, including courses 17 in the arts and sciences, that should be available to all students;
- 18 **[(2)] (II)** Provide lower level undergraduate courses, in accordance with credit transfer guidelines set by the Maryland Higher Education Commission, for students who aspire to continue their education at a senior institution;
- [(3)] (III) Provide technical and career education programs;
- [(4)] (IV) Provide training in skills and fields of study of importance to the region's business community;
- 24 **[(5)] (V)** Provide a wide variety of continuing education programs to 25 benefit citizens of the community;
- 26 [(6)] (VI) Provide developmental and remedial education for citizens with 27 needs in these areas; and
- 28 [(7)] (VII) Provide public services to the community's citizens.
- 29 (2) IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 16–610 OF THIS ARTICLE, THE COLLEGE 30 OF SOUTHERN MARYLAND MAY PROVIDE UPPER LEVEL UNDERGRADUATE COURSES 31 AND DEGREE PROGRAMS AND MAY AWARD BACHELOR'S DEGREES.

- 10 SECRETARY, SHALL ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE
- 11 IMPLEMENTATION OF BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMS AND THE AWARDING OF
- 12 BACHELOR'S DEGREES AT THE COLLEGE.

- 14 1, 2015.
