1 (i) Fix, revise, charge, and collect rentals, rates, fees, tolls, and other 2 charges and revenues for its use or for its services; and

3 (ii) Contract with any person who desires its use for any purpose and 4 fix the terms, conditions, rentals, rates, fees, tolls, or other charges or revenues for this use.

5 (b) The rentals, rates, fees, tolls, and other charges and revenues designated as 6 security for any bonds issued under this subtitle shall be fixed and adjusted from time to 7 time, either with respect to a particular transportation facilities project or in respect of the 8 aggregate of the charges and revenues from other transportation facilities projects under 9 the control of the Authority, as may be specified by law or in any applicable resolution or 10 trust agreement, so as to provide funds that, together with any other available revenues, 11 are sufficient as long as the bonds are outstanding and unpaid to:

12 (1) Pay the costs of maintaining, repairing, and operating the 13 transportation facilities project or projects financed in whole or in part by one or more series 14 of outstanding and unpaid bonds, to the extent that payment is not otherwise provided;

15 (2) Pay the principal of and the interest on these bonds as they become due 16 and payable;

17 (3) Create reasonable reserves that are anticipated will be needed for these18 purposes; and

19 (4) Provide funds for paying the cost of replacements, renewals, and 20 improvements.

(c) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the rentals, rates, fees,
 tolls, and other charges and revenues are not subject to supervision or regulation by any
 instrumentality, agency, or unit of this State or any of its political subdivisions.

24 (2) This subtitle does not permit the exercise of any power or the 25 undertaking of any activity that would conflict with the provisions and limitations of the 26 federal Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964.

(3) Tolls for the use of the bridge carrying the John F. Kennedy Memorial
Highway over the Susquehanna River may not be less than the comparable tolls charged
for the use of the Susquehanna River Bridge.

30 (4) THE AUTHORITY SHALL OFFER TO USERS OF THE FRANCIS SCOTT 31 KEY BRIDGE THE SAME TOLL DISCOUNT PLANS THAT THE AUTHORITY OFFERED TO 32 USERS OF THE THOMAS J. HATEM MEMORIAL BRIDGE ON JANUARY 1, 2015.

[(4)] (5) Prior to fixing or revising tolls on any part of any transportation
 facilities project, the Authority shall provide, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State
 Government Article, to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, Senate Finance

- 3 (i) The annual revenues generated by the toll charges;
- 4 (ii) The proposed use of the revenues; and
- 5 (iii) The proposed commuter discount rates.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 7 1, 2015.
