CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Justice Reinvestment Coordinating Council

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Justice Reinvestment Coordinating Council in the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention; providing for the composition, 4 5 chair, and staffing of the Council; prohibiting a member of the Council from receiving 6 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 7 establishing the duties of the Council; requiring the Council to report its interim and 8 final findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly on or 9 before certain dates; a certain date; making this Act an emergency measure; 10 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Justice 11 Reinvestment Coordinating Council.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective through December 31, 2018, and, at the end of December 31, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
