- 9 (c) The certificate of candidacy for the election of a write—in candidate shall be 10 filed by the earlier of:
- 11 (1) 7 days after a total expenditure of at least \$51 is made to promote the candidacy by a campaign finance entity of the candidate; or
- 13 (2) 5 p.m. on the [Wednesday preceding the day of the election] **7TH DAY**14 **PRECEDING THE START OF EARLY VOTING** for which the certificate is filed.

- 16 <u>(a) This section applies only to a petition that will affect the right of a candidate</u> 17 to have the candidate's name appear on the ballot in a primary or general election.
- 18 (b) A registered voter who is a resident of the district or other geographic area in 19 which a candidate is seeking office may file a petition with the circuit court for that district 20 or geographic area to challenge the candidate's residency as provided in § 5–202 of this title.


