## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

#### $\mathbf{2}$ **Office of Cemetery Oversight – Conservation Cemeteries – Perpetual Care Trust** 3 **Fund Requirements**

4 FOR the purpose of reducing the minimum amount that a certain registered cemeterian or  $\mathbf{5}$ permit holder that operates a conservation cemetery is required to deposit initially 6 into the perpetual care trust fund; reducing the percentage of the selling price of a 7 right of interment in a burial lot in a conservation cemetery that the registered 8 cemeterian or permit holder operating the conservation cemetery is required to pay 9 in cash to a certain trustee for deposit into the perpetual care trust fund; defining a certain term; and generally relating to perpetual care trust fund requirements for 10 11 conservation cemeteries.

11 (1) the establishment, improvement, care, preservation, or embellishment 12 of a cemetery;

13 (2) interment; and

14 (3) the providing of burial space or burial goods.

7 (a) In this section, "developed land area" means land in a cemetery:

- 8 (1) that is available for burial;
- 9 (2) where roads, paths, or buildings have been laid out or built; or

10 (3) where burial lots have been outlined on a plat or in a record or sales 11 brochure.

12 (b) (1) Each sole proprietor registered cemeterian, permit holder, or any other 13 person subject to the registration or permit provisions of this title who sells or offers to sell 14 to the public a burial lot or burial right in a cemetery as to which perpetual care is stated 15 or implied shall have a perpetual care trust fund.

16 (2) A separate perpetual care trust fund shall be established for each 17 cemetery to which this section applies.

18 (3) On the general price list, contract of sale of burial space, and any 19 conveyance documents, all cemeteries subject to the provisions of this subtitle shall state 20 in writing the following using 12 point or larger type font:

(i) "The cemetery is a perpetual care cemetery."; or

(ii) "The cemetery is not a perpetual care cemetery."

(4) A cemetery created in the State after October 1, 2001, that is not
 exempt under § 5–602 of this subtitle shall be required to establish a perpetual care trust
 fund.

(c) (1) [Each] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
 SUBSECTION, EACH sole proprietor registered cemeterian, permit holder, or any other
 person subject to the trust requirements of this subtitle initially shall deposit in the
 perpetual care trust fund at least:

30 [(1)] (I) \$10,000, if the developed land area of the cemetery is 10 acres or 31 less and the cemetery is a nonprofit cemetery which does not sell burial goods;

1 [(2)] (II) \$25,000, if the developed land area of the cemetery is more than 2 10 acres and the cemetery is a nonprofit cemetery which does not sell burial goods;

3 [(3)] (III) \$25,000, if the developed land area of the cemetery is 10 acres or 4 less and the cemetery is a for-profit cemetery or a nonprofit cemetery which sells burial 5 goods; or

6 [(4)] (IV) \$50,000, if the developed land area of the cemetery is more than 7 10 acres and the cemetery is a for-profit cemetery or a nonprofit cemetery which sells burial 8 goods.

#### 9 (2) EACH SOLE PROPRIETOR REGISTERED CEMETERIAN OR PERMIT 10 HOLDER THAT OPERATES A CONSERVATION CEMETERY SHALL DEPOSIT INITIALLY 11 IN THE PERPETUAL CARE TRUST FUND AT LEAST \$10,000.

12 (d) (1) The deposits required by this subsection are in addition to the deposits 13 required by subsection (c) of this section.

14 (2) Except as provided in [paragraph (4)] PARAGRAPHS (4) AND (5) of 15 this subsection, within 30 days after the end of the month when the buyer of a right of 16 interment in a burial lot, above–ground crypt, or niche makes a final payment, the 17 registered cemeterian, permit holder, or any other person subject to the trust requirements 18 of this subtitle shall pay in cash to the trustee for deposit in the perpetual care trust fund:

19 (i) at least 10% of the actual selling price of each right of interment 20 in a burial lot, above–ground crypt, or niche; or

(ii) if the burial space is sold at a discount or at no cost, at least 10%
of the imputed cost of the fair retail value.

(3) The amount of deposit to the perpetual care trust fund shall be deducted
from the proceeds of the listed selling price of the right of interment in a burial lot,
above–ground crypt, or niche, and may not be charged as an add–on to the purchaser.

26 (4) This subsection does not apply to the sale of a second right of interment 27 or the resale of a right of interment in a burial lot, above–ground crypt, or niche for which 28 the cemetery already has paid into the perpetual care trust fund the deposit required by 29 this subsection.

30 (5) WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE END OF THE MONTH WHEN THE
 31 BUYER OF A RIGHT OF INTERMENT IN A BURIAL LOT IN A CONSERVATION CEMETERY
 32 MAKES A FINAL PAYMENT, THE REGISTERED CEMETERIAN OR PERMIT HOLDER THAT
 33 OPERATES THE CONSERVATION CEMETERY SHALL PAY IN CASH TO THE TRUSTEE
 34 FOR DEPOSIT IN THE PERPETUAL CARE TRUST FUND:

1(I) AT LEAST 2% OF THE ACTUAL SELLING PRICE OF EACH2RIGHT OF INTERMENT IN A BURIAL LOT; OR

# 3 (II) IF THE BURIAL LOT IS SOLD AT A DISCOUNT OR AT NO COST, 4 AT LEAST 2% OF THE IMPUTED COST OF THE FAIR RETAIL VALUE.

- 5 (e) The income from the perpetual care trust fund:
- 6
- (1) shall be used only for the perpetual care of the cemetery, including:

7 (i) the maintenance, including the cutting of grass abutting 8 memorials or monuments, administration, supervision, and embellishment of the cemetery 9 and its grounds, roads, and paths; and

- 10 (ii) the repair and renewal of buildings, including columbaria and 11 mausoleums, and the property of the cemetery; and
- 12

(2) may not be used to care for memorials or monuments.

13 (f) Realized capital gains of a perpetual care trust fund are not income of the 14 perpetual care trust fund and shall be deposited in the perpetual care trust fund as 15 principal of the perpetual care trust fund.

16 (g) (1) The perpetual care trust fund authorized by this subsection shall be a 17 single purpose trust fund.

18 In the event of the bankruptcy or insolvency of, or assignment for the (2)19benefit of creditors by, or an adverse judgment against the sole proprietor registered 20cemeterian, permit holder, or any other person subject to the trust requirements of this 21subtitle, the perpetual care trust funds may not be made available to any creditor as assets 22of the sole proprietor registered cemeterian, permit holder, or any other person subject to 23the trust requirements of this subtitle or as payment for any expenses of any bankruptcy or similar proceedings, but shall be retained intact to provide for the future maintenance 2425of the cemetery.

(3) The perpetual care trust fund is not subject to judgment, execution,
garnishment, attachment, or other seizure by process in bankruptcy or otherwise, or to sale,
pledge, mortgage, or other alienation and is not assignable.

(h) A sole proprietor registered cemeterian, permit holder, or any other person subject to the trust requirements of this subtitle shall maintain in the office of the cemetery a copy of the most recent trust report filed with the Office under § 5–606 of this subtitle and shall make the report available for inspection by an owner or a prospective purchaser of a right of interment in a burial lot, above–ground crypt, or niche. 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2015.
