1 AN ACT concerning

Blind or Visually Impaired Children – Individualized Education Programs – Orientation and Mobility Instruction

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain individualized education programs for certain blind $\mathbf{5}$ or visually impaired children to include certain orientation and mobility instruction 6 under certain circumstances; establishing a certain process for a certain 7 individualized education program team to make a certain determination as to 8 whether certain orientation and mobility instruction is appropriate for a certain 9 child and to include it in a certain child's individualized education program; requiring certain orientation and mobility evaluations assessments to be provided 10 11 conducted under certain circumstances; requiring a certain orientation and mobility 12evaluation assessment to contain, at a minimum, certain content; requiring certain 13local school systems to provide certain parents and guardians with a certain verbal and written notice at a certain time; requiring certain orientation and mobility 14 15instruction to be provided by a certain qualified individual; requiring the State 16 Department of Education to adopt certain regulations and provide certain guidelines 17on or before certain dates; defining certain terms; making certain stylistic changes; 18and generally relating to orientation and mobility instruction in individualized 19education programs for blind or visually impaired children.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, $\mathbf{5}$ 6 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 7**Article – Education** 8 8-408. 9 (1)In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) "ASSESSMENT" MEANS THE PROCESS OF COLLECTING DATA TO BE 10 (2) USED BY AN IEP TEAM TO DETERMINE A STUDENT'S NEED FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION 11 12AND RELATED SERVICES. 13(3) "BRAILLE" MEANS THE SYSTEM OF READING AND WRITING 14THROUGH TOUCH COMMONLY KNOWN AS STANDARD ENGLISH CONTRACTED 15**BRAILLE.** 16 (2) (4) "Child who is blind or visually impaired" means a child who: 17(i) Has a visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye with correcting lenses or has a limited field of vision so that the widest diameter of the visual 18 field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees; 1920Has a medically indicated expectation of visual deterioration; or (ii) 21(iii) Has a medically diagnosed limitation in visual functioning that 22restricts the child's ability to read and write standard print at levels expected of other 23children of comparable ability and grade level. 24"Braille" means the system of reading and writing through touch (3) 25commonly known as Standard English Contracted Braille. 26(4) (5) "Individualized education program" and "IEP team" have the same 27meaning as provided by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. 28(5) (6) "National Instructional Materials Access Center" means the center 29established under § 674(e) of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education 30 Improvement Act of 2004. (6) (7) "NIMAS" means the National Instructional Materials Accessibility 31

Standard established by the federal Secretary for Education under 20 U.S.C. 1412 to be

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used in the preparation of electronic files suitable and used solely for efficient conversion
 into specialized formats.

3 (7) (8) "ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY" MEANS INSTRUCTION 4 PROVIDED TO A CHILD WHO IS BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED TO ENABLE THE CHILD 5 TO ATTAIN SYSTEMATIC ORIENTATION TO AND SAFE MOVEMENT WITHIN THE 6 CHILD'S SCHOOL, HOME, AND COMMUNITY ENVIRONMENTS.

7 [(7)] (8) (9) "Print instructional materials" means printed textbooks and 8 related printed core materials that are written and published primarily for use in 9 elementary school and secondary school instruction and are required by the Department or 10 county board for use by students in the classroom.

[(8)] (9) (10) "Specialized formats" means braille, large print, audio, or
 digital text that is used by blind or visually impaired individuals.

(b) (1) In developing the individualized education program for a child who is blind or visually impaired, provisions shall be made for instruction in braille and the use of braille unless the IEP team determines, after an evaluation of the child's reading and writing skills, needs, and appropriate reading and writing media, including an evaluation of the child's future needs for instruction in braille or the use of braille, that such instruction or use is not appropriate for the child.

19 [(2)] (I) A child may not be denied the opportunity for instruction in 20 braille reading and writing solely because the child has some remaining vision.

[(3)] (II) This section does not require the exclusive use of braille if other reading and writing media are appropriate to the child's educational needs. The use of other reading and writing media does not preclude the use of braille or the instruction of braille.

[(c)] (2) For the purpose of achieving successful implementation of this [section] SUBSECTION, the State Board and the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board shall adopt certification standards for teachers of blind and visually impaired students.

[(d) (1)] (3) (I) The Department shall collaborate with and provide support to the Instructional Resources Center to develop procedures to coordinate the statewide availability of textbooks and supplementary instructional materials that may be accessed using specialized formats that use NIMAS.

32 [(2) (i)] (II) 1. The procedures developed under [paragraph (1) of 33 this subsection] SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH shall require the Department 34 and a county board to include, in any procurement contract or other document or agreement 35 used to purchase print instructional materials from a publisher, a provision that requires 36 the publisher to:

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[1.] **A**. 1 On or before the delivery of the print instructional $\mathbf{2}$ materials, prepare and provide the National Instructional Materials Access Center 3 electronic files containing the contents of the print instructional materials using NIMAS; 4 or $\mathbf{5}$ [2.] **B**. Purchase instructional materials from that 6 publisher that are produced in, or may be rendered in, specialized formats. 7(ii)] **2**. A publisher may not be required to provide an electronic 8 copy of any instructional material copyrighted before July 1, 2007.

9 [(3)] (III) The State Board shall coordinate with the National Instructional 10 Materials Access Center to facilitate the timely transfer to the Instructional Resources 11 Center of:

12 [(i)] **1.** Electronic files or instructional materials sent by 13 publishers for the Instructional Resources Center to convert the instructional materials 14 into specialized formats; and

15 [(ii)] **2.** Electronic files or instructional materials purchased from 16 a publisher in a specialized format.

[(4)] (IV) Beginning on July 1, 2007, the Instructional Resources Center shall make reasonable efforts to provide the instructional materials in specialized formats to students who are blind or visually impaired for use on the first day of classes each year or in a timely manner.

[(e)] (4) Beginning in fiscal year 2008 and annually thereafter, the Governor shall include \$150,000 in the annual budget submission for the Instructional Resources Center established by the Department.

24 [(f) The State Board shall adopt regulations consistent with § 7–910 of this article 25 to implement the provisions of this section.]

[(g)] (5) On or before September 1, 2012, the State Board shall establish standards for the mastery of braille for use in English, language arts, and mathematics instruction of blind and visually impaired students in pre-kindergarten through grade 12.
