18 19	(a) Unless the Secretary declares an emergency or disease epidemic, the Department may not require the immunization of an individual if:
20 21	(1) The individual objects to immunization because it conflicts with the individual's bona fide religious beliefs and practices; or

- 1 (2) The individual is a minor and the individual's parent or guardian 2 objects to immunization because it conflicts with the parent or guardian's bona fide 3 religious beliefs and practices.
