1 AN ACT concerning

Criminal Procedure – Financial Crimes Against Vulnerable and Elder Adults – Petition to Freeze Assets

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a State's Attorney to file a petition to freeze assets of a $\mathbf{5}$ defendant charged with a certain financial crime involving a vulnerable or elder 6 adult under certain circumstances; requiring that a petition to freeze assets be 7served in accordance with the Maryland Rules and include certain information; requiring that a petition to freeze assets be mailed to certain lienholders and certain 8 9 financial institutions; authorizing a court to grant a petition to freeze assets and 10 issue an order to freeze assets under certain circumstances; requiring that an order 11 to freeze assets be served on certain financial institutions in accordance with the 12Maryland Rules and include certain information; providing that a financial institution is not obligated to restrict access to money described in a petition to freeze 13 14 assets until the occurrence of certain events; requiring that an order to freeze assets 15remain in effect for a certain period of time; authorizing the court to modify an order 16 to freeze assets under certain circumstances; specifying that a certain lienholder is 17not prohibited from exercising certain rights if a default occurs in the obligation 18 giving rise to the lien; specifying that a certain financial institution is not prohibited 19 from exercising certain rights; defining certain terms; and generally relating to 20petitions to freeze assets.
