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## Vehicle Laws - Operation of Vehicle When Approaching a Service Vehicle

- FOR the purpose of requiring drivers approaching a service vehicle that is stopped, standing, or parked on a highway and using certain visual signals, unless otherwise directed by a police officer or a traffic control device, to make a lane change into an available lane not immediately adjacent to the service vehicle under certain circumstances or to slow to a reasonable and prudent speed that is safe for certain existing conditions under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the rules of the road when approaching service vehicles.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 22 Article Transportation
- 23 21–405.



- Unless otherwise directed by a police officer or a traffic control device, when an emergency vehicle [or], a tow truck that is properly registered in accordance with § 13–920 of this article, OR A SERVICE VEHICLE, AS DEFINED IN § 22–201 OF THIS ARTICLE, using any visual signal that meets the requirements of § 22–218 of this article is stopped, standing, or parked on a highway, the driver of a motor vehicle approaching the emergency vehicle [or], tow truck, OR SERVICE VEHICLE from the rear shall:
- 7 (1) If practicable and not otherwise prohibited, make a lane change into an 8 available lane not immediately adjacent to the emergency vehicle [or], tow truck, OR 9 SERVICE VEHICLE with due regard for safety and traffic conditions; or
- 10 (2) If the driver of the motor vehicle is unable to make a lane change in 11 accordance with item (1) of this subsection, slow to a reasonable and prudent speed that is 12 safe for existing weather, road, and vehicular or pedestrian traffic conditions.

- In this subtitle, "service vehicles" means any of the following vehicles that are designated by the Administration as service vehicles:
- 16 (1) Vehicles of federal, State, or local agencies;
- 17 (2) Vehicles of public service companies; and
- 18 (3) Vehicles of persons performing governmental functions under a contract with any federal, State, or local government.

- 21 (c) (6) Service vehicles, rural letter carrier vehicles, slow moving farm 22 vehicles, and tow trucks may be equipped with or display yellow or amber lights or signal 23 devices.
- 24 (11) The yellow or amber lights or signal devices permitted on vehicles 25 under paragraph (6) of this subsection may be flashed or oscillated or otherwise used only 26 in the course of official duties, to indicate to the public that the vehicle is a slow moving 27 vehicle or otherwise is impeding traffic.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
