Natural Resources - Nuisance Organisms - Reward for Information

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a judge to award a reward to a person providing information leading to a conviction for a violation of certain nuisance organism laws or regulations; requiring a certain reward to be paid from certain fine proceeds in an amount not to exceed a certain percentage of fines imposed; prohibiting a reward from being awarded to a law enforcement officer or an employee of the Department of Natural Resources; and generally relating to nuisance organism laws and regulations.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 Article - Natural Resources

- 23 4–205.1.
- 24 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

- 1 (8) "Nuisance organism" means a nonnative aquatic organism that will foreseeably alter and threaten to harm the ecosystem or the abundance and diversity of native or naturalized fish and other organisms.
- 4 (i) (1) In addition to any other penalty provided under law, a person who violates a provision of this section or a regulation adopted under this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or both for each offense, but not exceeding a total of \$25,000 for offenses arising out of the same enforcement action.
- 9 (2) Each nuisance organism imported or possessed in violation of this section or a regulation adopted under this section constitutes a separate offense.
- 11 (3) (I) IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS PARAGRAPH, ON CONVICTION 12 FOR A VIOLATION UNDER THIS SECTION, THE JUDGE MAY AWARD A REWARD TO A 13 PERSON PROVIDING INFORMATION LEADING TO THE CONVICTION.
- 14 (II) A REWARD SHALL BE PAID FROM THE FINE PROCEEDS IN AN 15 AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF OF THE FINE IMPOSED ON CONVICTION.
- 16 (III) A REWARD MAY NOT BE AWARDED TO A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
