1 AN ACT concerning

2 Recreational Hunting and Fishing License Applications – Voter Registration

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections and the Department of Natural 4 Resources to jointly develop and implement procedures for persons who apply for the issuance or renewal of a recreational hunting or fishing license online to be offered $\mathbf{5}$ 6 the opportunity to register to vote through a link to Maryland's Online Voter 7 Registration System; prohibiting the Department of Natural Resources from being 8 deemed a voter registration agency for the purposes of providing, accepting, and 9 forwarding to the State Board voter registration applications; and generally relating 10 to the inclusion of voter registration in the application process for recreational 11 hunting and fishing licenses.

7 8 9 10	(iii) boxes for the applicant to check to indicate whether the applicant would like to register or declines to register to vote together with the statement (in close proximity to the boxes and in prominent type), "If you do not check either box, you will be considered to have decided not to register to vote at this time.";
11 12 13	(iv) the statement, "If you would like help in filling out the voter registration application form, we will help you. The decision whether to seek or accept help is yours. You may fill out the application form in private.";
14 15 16 17 18	(v) the statement, "If you believe that someone has interfered with your right to register or to decline to register to vote, your right to privacy in deciding whether to register or in applying to register to vote, or your right to choose your own political party or other political preference, you may file a complaint with the State Board of Elections."; and
19	(vi) the address and toll free telephone number of the State Board;
20 21 22 23	(3) provide each applicant who does not decline to register to vote and who accepts assistance the same degree of assistance with regard to completion of the registration application as is provided by the office with regard to the completion of its own applications, unless the applicant refuses such assistance; and

If the individual requests a voter registration application, the institution shall provide, or cause to be provided, an application to the individual.
