2 Constitutional Amendment - Orphans' Court Judges - Election and Term Limits

- 3 FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to require a judge of the Orphans' Court to hold the office for a certain term; providing for the 4 5 judges of the Orphans' Court to be elected by certain voters at a certain election; 6 establishing that a judge of the Orphans' Court shall hold the office from the election 7 of the judge until a successor is elected and qualified; providing an exception to a 8 constitutional requirement for the term of certain elected officers; repealing a certain 9 obsolete reference; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection. 10

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 22 (A) A JUDGE OF THE ORPHANS' COURT SHALL HOLD THE OFFICE FOR A
- 23 TERM OF 8 YEARS.

- (B) A JUDGE OF THE ORPHANS' COURT SHALL BE ELECTED BY THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY OR COUNTY AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN NOVEMBER.
- 4 (C) A JUDGE OF THE ORPHANS' COURT SHALL HOLD THE OFFICE FROM THE 5 TIME OF THE ELECTION OF THE JUDGE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED AND 6 QUALIFIED.

- All State and county officers elected by qualified voters (except JUDGES OF THE ORPHANS' COURTS, judges of the Circuit Courts, [judges of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City,] judges of the Court of Appeals and judges of any intermediate courts of appeal) shall hold office for terms of four years, and until their successors shall qualify.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.
 - SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2016 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
