A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore County – Miscellaneous Business Licenses – Fees**

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain license fees that applicants are required to pay for
4 keeping a billiard table for commercial use, for doing certain construction business,
5 for keeping a garage where motor vehicles are stored for a fee, for doing the business
6 of cleaning or laundering, for doing business as a plumber or gas fitter, for operating
7 a restaurant, for doing business as a trader, and for operating a chain store; and
8 generally relating to business license fees in Baltimore County.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Business Regulation**

18 17–504.

19 An applicant for a billiard table license shall pay to the clerk a license fee of:

20 (1) \$10 for each billiard table in a county other than Baltimore City[,
21 Baltimore County,] or Cecil County;

22 (2) \$20 for each billiard table in Cecil County; or

3 (a) An applicant for a construction license shall pay to the clerk a license fee of:

4 (1) \$15 for a construction license in a county other than Baltimore City [,

5 Baltimore County,] or Cecil County;

6 (2) \$40 for a construction license in Baltimore City [or Baltimore County];

7 or

8 (3) \$30 for a construction license in Cecil County.

9 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, an applicant for

10 a nonresident construction license shall pay to the clerk:

11 (i) a license fee of:

12 1. \$50 for a nonresident construction license in a county

13 other than Baltimore City [or Baltimore County]; or

14 2. \$60 for a nonresident construction license in Baltimore

15 City [or Baltimore County]; and

16 (ii) for each contract for which the applicant is required to get an

17 additional nonresident construction license, an additional license fee of:

18 1. \$50, if the contract will be performed in a county other

19 than Baltimore City [or Baltimore County]; or

20 2. \$60, if the contract will be performed in Baltimore City [or

21 Baltimore County].

22 (2) An applicant for a nonresident construction license who is incorporated

23 or has its principal office in another state shall pay to the clerk the total fees imposed in

24 that state on a similar nonresident business if the total fees are higher than the total license

25 fees under this section.

26 17–803.

27 (a) (1) An applicant for a garage license shall pay to the clerk a license fee

28 based on the floor area of each garage.

29 (2) In a county other than Baltimore City [or Baltimore County], the

30 license fee is:

- (i) \$20 for a garage with not more than 2,000 square feet;
 - (ii) \$40 for a garage with more than 2,000 and not more than 3,000
 - (iii) \$75 for a garage with more than 3,000 and not more than 5,000
 - (iv) \$125 for a garage with more than 5,000 and not more than 7,500
 - (v) \$200 for a garage with more than 7,500 and not more than 10,000
 - (vi) \$200 for a garage with more than 10,000 square feet plus \$50 for 00 square feet or part of 5,000 square feet.

(3) In Baltimore City [or Baltimore County], the license fee is \$6 for each feet of each garage.

(b) The floor area on which the license fee is based is the total floor area of all of the garage, excluding:

(1) the space occupied by a machine shop that is defined by permanent partitions; and

(2) the floor area of a space 15 feet wide and extending the entire length of the garage on each floor on which a law requires that a space be kept open.

(a) An applicant for a license shall pay to the clerk the applicable license fee.

(b) In a county other than Baltimore City [or Baltimore County], the license fee

(1) \$15 for a business that employs not more than 10 individuals;

(2) \$50 for a business that employs 11 to 20 individuals; and

(3) \$100 for a business that employs more than 20 individuals.

(c) In Baltimore City [or Baltimore County], the license fee is:

(1) \$40 for a business that employs not more than 10 individuals;

- 1 (2) \$125 for a business that employs 11 to 20 individuals; and
2 (3) \$250 for a business that employs more than 20 individuals.

4 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) or (c) of this section, an
5 applicant for a plumber's license shall pay to the clerk a license fee of:

6 (1) \$5 for each place of business in a municipal corporation with a
7 population of less than 5,000;

8 (2) \$10 for each place of business in a municipal corporation with a
9 population of 5,000 to 9,999;

10 (3) \$15 for each place of business in a municipal corporation with a
11 population of 10,000 or more; or

12 (4) \$40 for each place of business in Baltimore City [or Baltimore County].

13 17-1604.

14 An applicant for a restaurant license shall pay to the clerk a license fee of:

15 (1) \$50 for each place of business in Baltimore City[, Baltimore County,]
16 or Cecil County;

17 (2) \$25 for each place of business in a municipal corporation with a
18 population of 8,000 or more in any other county; or

19 (3) \$10 for each place of business elsewhere in the State.

20 17-1808.

21 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an applicant for a trader's
22 license shall pay to the clerk a license fee based on the value of the applicant's
23 stock-in-trade.

24 (2) In a county other than Baltimore City [or Baltimore County], the
25 license fee is:

26 (i) \$15, if the value of the applicant's stock-in-trade is not more
27 than \$1,000;

28 (ii) \$18, if the value is more than \$1,000 but not more than \$1,500;

29 (iii) \$20, if the value is more than \$1,500 but not more than \$2,500;

- (iv) \$25, if the value is more than \$2,500 but not more than \$4,000;
 - (v) \$30, if the value is more than \$4,000 but not more than \$6,000;
 - (vi) \$40, if the value is more than \$6,000 but not more than \$8,000;
 - (vii) \$50, if the value is more than \$8,000 but not more than \$10,000;
 - (viii) \$65, if the value is more than \$10,000 but not more than \$15,000;
 - (ix) \$80, if the value is more than \$15,000 but not more than \$20,000;
 - (x) \$100, if the value is more than \$20,000 but not more than
 - (xi) \$125, if the value is more than \$30,000 but not more than
 - (xii) \$150, if the value is more than \$40,000 but not more than
 - (xiii) \$200, if the value is more than \$50,000 but not more than
 - (xiv) \$250, if the value is more than \$75,000 but not more than
 - (xv) \$300, if the value is more than \$100,000 but not more than
 - (xvi) \$350, if the value is more than \$150,000 but not more than
 - (xvii) \$400, if the value is more than \$200,000 but not more than
 - (xviii) \$500, if the value is more than \$300,000 but not more than
 - (xix) \$600, if the value is more than \$400,000 but not more than
 - (xx) \$750, if the value is more than \$500,000 but not more than
 - (xxi) \$800, if the value is more than \$750,000.

- 2 (i) \$20, if the value of the applicant's stock-in-trade is not more
3 than \$1,000;
- 4 (ii) \$40, if the value is more than \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000;
- 5 (iii) \$80, if the value is more than \$5,000 but not more than \$10,000;
- 6 (iv) \$160, if the value is more than \$10,000 but not more than
7 \$50,000;
- 8 (v) \$375, if the value is more than \$50,000 but not more than
9 \$100,000;
- 10 (vi) \$1,000, if the value is more than \$100,000 but not more than
11 \$300,000;
- 12 (vii) \$1,500, if the value is more than \$300,000 but not more than
13 \$750,000; or
- 14 (viii) \$2,125, if the value is more than \$750,000.
- 15 [(4) In Baltimore County, the license fee is:
- 16 (i) \$20, if the value of the applicant's stock-in-trade is not more
17 than \$1,000;
- 18 (ii) \$40, if the value is more than \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000;
- 19 (iii) \$80, if the value is more than \$5,000 but not more than \$10,000;
- 20 (iv) \$160, if the value is more than \$10,000 but not more than
21 \$50,000;
- 22 (v) \$375, if the value is more than \$50,000 but not more than
23 \$100,000;
- 24 (vi) \$450, if the value is more than \$100,000 but not more than
25 \$200,000;
- 26 (vii) \$500, if the value is more than \$200,000 but not more than
27 \$300,000;
- 28 (viii) \$775, if the value is more than \$300,000 but not more than
29 \$400,000;

- (ix) \$1,000, if the value is more than \$400,000 but not more than
 - (x) \$1,250, if the value is more than \$500,000 but not more than
 - (xi) \$1,600, if the value is more than \$750,000.]

(b) (1) An applicant for a chain store license shall pay to the clerk a license fee based on the value of the applicant's stock-in-trade under § 17-1808 of this subtitle and an additional license fee.

(2) In a county other than Baltimore City[, Baltimore County,] or Cecil County, the additional license fee is:

- (i) \$5 for each store for 2 to 5 stores;
 - (ii) \$20 for each store for 6 to 10 stores;
 - (iii) \$100 for each store for 11 to 20 stores; or
 - (iv) \$150 for each store for more than 20 stores.

16 (3) In Baltimore City [or Baltimore County], the additional license fee is:

- (i) \$12 for each store for 2 to 5 stores;
 - (ii) \$50 for each store for 6 to 10 stores;
 - (iii) \$250 for each store for 11 to 20 stores; or
 - (iv) \$375 for each store for more than 20 stores.

21 (4) In Cecil County, the additional license fee is:

- (i) \$10 for each store for 2 to 5 stores;
 - (ii) \$30 for each store for 6 to 10 stores;
 - (iii) \$100 for each store for 11 to 20 stores; and
 - (iv) \$300 for each store for more than 20 stores.
