## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Crime of Violence – Home Invasion**

3 FOR the purpose of classifying the offense of home invasion as a crime of violence under  
4 certain provisions of law; and generally relating to crimes of violence.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Criminal Law**

19 (b) (1) “Crime of violence” means:

- 1 (i) murder in any degree;
- 2 (ii) manslaughter;
- 3 (iii) kidnapping;
- 4 (iv) rape in any degree;
- 5 (v) assault in the first degree;
- 6 (vi) robbery under § 3–402 or § 3–403 of this article;
- 7 (vii) burglary in any degree;
- 8 (viii) **HOME INVASION UNDER § 6–202 (B) OF THIS ARTICLE;**
- 9 **(IX)** escape in the first degree; or
- 10 **[(ix)](X)** theft.

11 (2) “Crime of violence” includes an attempt to commit a crime listed in  
12 paragraph (1) of this subsection.

14 (a) In this section, “crime of violence” means:

- 15 (1) abduction;
- 16 (2) arson in the first degree;
- 17 (3) kidnapping;
- 18 (4) manslaughter, except involuntary manslaughter;
- 19 (5) mayhem;
- 20 (6) maiming, as previously proscribed under former Article 27, §§ 385 and  
21 386 of the Code;
- 22 (7) murder;
- 23 (8) rape;
- 24 (9) robbery under § 3–402 or § 3–403 of this article;

- 1 (10) carjacking;
- 2 (11) armed carjacking;
- 3 (12) sexual offense in the first degree;
- 4 (13) sexual offense in the second degree;
- 5 (14) use of a handgun in the commission of a felony or other crime of  
6 violence;
- 7 (15) child abuse in the first degree under § 3–601 of this article;
- 8 (16) sexual abuse of a minor under § 3–602 of this article if:
- 9 (i) the victim is under the age of 13 years and the offender is an  
10 adult at the time of the offense; and
- 11 (ii) the offense involved:
- 12 1. vaginal intercourse, as defined in § 3–301 of this article;
- 13 2. a sexual act, as defined in § 3–301 of this article;
- 14 3. an act in which a part of the offender’s body penetrates,  
15 however slightly, into the victim’s genital opening or anus; or
- 16 4. the intentional touching, not through the clothing, of the  
17 victim’s or the offender’s genital, anal, or other intimate area for sexual arousal,  
18 gratification, or abuse;
- 19 (17) an attempt to commit any of the crimes described in items (1) through  
20 (16) of this subsection;
- 21 (18) continuing course of conduct with a child under § 3–315 of this article;
- 22 (19) assault in the first degree;
- 23 (20) assault with intent to murder;
- 24 (21) assault with intent to rape;
- 25 (22) assault with intent to rob;
- 26 (23) assault with intent to commit a sexual offense in the first degree; [and]
- 27 (24) assault with intent to commit a sexual offense in the second degree; **OR**

**(25) HOME INVASION UNDER § 6-202(B) OF THIS ARTICLE.**

**Article – Public Safety**

5–101.

(c) “Crime of violence” means:

(1) abduction;

(2) arson in the first degree;

(3) assault in the first or second degree;

(4) burglary in the first, second, or third degree;

(5) carjacking and armed carjacking;

(6) escape in the first degree;

(7) kidnapping;

(8) voluntary manslaughter;

(9) maiming as previously proscribed under former Article 27, § 386 of the Code;

(10) mayhem as previously proscribed under former Article 27, § 384 of the Code;

(11) murder in the first or second degree;

(12) rape in the first or second degree;

(13) robbery;

(14) robbery with a dangerous weapon;

(15) sexual offense in the first, second, or third degree;

**(16) HOME INVASION UNDER § 6-202(B) OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;**

**(17) an attempt to commit any of the crimes listed in items (1) through [(15)](16) of this subsection; or**

1                    [(17)] **(18)** assault with intent to commit any of the crimes listed in items  
2 (1) through [(15)] **(16)** of this subsection or a crime punishable by imprisonment for more  
3 than 1 year.

4                    SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
5 October 1, 2015.
