## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning 2 Harford County - School Buses - Length of Operation 3 FOR the purpose of altering the length of time a school bus may be operated in Harford County; and generally relating to school bus operations in Harford County. 4 5 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 6 Article – Education 7 Section 7-804 8 Annotated Code of Maryland 9 (2014 Replacement Volume and 2014 Supplement) 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 11 Article - Education 1213 7 - 804. In this section, "school vehicle" has the meaning stated in § 11-154 of the 14 (a) Transportation Article. 15 16 Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, unless (b) 17 it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety standards, a school vehicle 18 may be operated for 12 years. 19 In Calvert, Caroline, Cecil, Charles, Dorchester, HARFORD, (2)20 Kent, Queen Anne's, St. Mary's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico, and Worcester counties, 21unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety standards, a school 22 vehicle may be operated for 15 years.



- 1 A school vehicle operating under subparagraph (i) of this (ii) 2 paragraph shall be maintained as provided in subsection (c) of this section. 3 Any school vehicle in operation or accepted before July 1, 2004, or under 4 contract to be purchased before July 1, 2004, that meets the specifications of the Department and of the Motor Vehicle Administration for transit style school vehicles may 5 6 be operated for 15 years. 7 Notwithstanding the 12-year limitation in subsection (b)(1) of this section, a 8 school vehicle may be operated for additional years if: 9 (1) The school vehicle is maintained under a preventive maintenance plan 10 approved by the Motor Vehicle Administration and the Automotive Safety Enforcement 11 Division of the Department of State Police that includes an inspection at the end of the 12th 12 year and a minimum of 2 inspections by the Motor Vehicle Administration each year 13 thereafter: 14 (2)Any structural repairs to the school vehicle necessitated by accident, 15 metal fatigue, or any other cause are certified by an independent expert approved by the Motor Vehicle Administration to meet or exceed the manufacturer's original manufacturing 16 17 standards: 18 (3) The school vehicle is equipped with: 19 (i) The body originally placed on the chassis by the manufacturer; 20 An 8 light warning system; (ii) 21A left side stop arm; (iii) 22(iv) A fire-retardant driver's seat; 23Fire-retardant barriers in the case of a school vehicle with a (v) 24front engine; and 25(vi) A fire-retardant rear seating area in the case of a school vehicle 26 with a rear engine; and 27 **(4)** The State Superintendent grants approval. 28 (d) If a school vehicle passes an inspection that is required under subsection (c)(1) 29of this section:
- 30 (1) The inspection shall be valid in the county in which the inspection was 31 completed; and

(2) If ownership of the school vehicle is transferred to a person who operates the school vehicle in a county in which school vehicles are authorized under subsection (b)(2) of this section to be operated for 15 years, the inspection shall be valid in that county for the length of time that the inspection would have been valid in the county where the inspection was completed.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June  $7-1,\,2015.$
