### CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Behavioral Health Administration – Behavioral Health Advisory Council

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Behavioral Health Advisory Council in the Office of  
4 the Governor; providing for the purpose, duties, and membership of the Council;  
5 requiring the Council to appoint the chair of the Council; providing for the terms of  
6 members; authorizing the Council to adopt certain procedures; authorizing the chair  
7 to designate certain individuals to serve on a committee or task force of the Council;  
8 requiring the Council to meet at least a certain number of times a year; providing  
9 that a member may not receive compensation as a member of the Council but is  
10 entitled to certain reimbursement for expenses; requiring the Behavioral Health  
11 Administration to provide certain staff for the Council; repealing the Maryland  
12 Advisory Council on Mental Hygiene and the State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council;  
13 making certain conforming changes; and generally relating to the Behavioral Health  
14 Advisory Council.

16                   **(C) THE COUNCIL SHALL APPOINT A CHAIR FROM AMONG THE**  
17 **MEMBERSHIP OF THE COUNCIL.**

18                   **(D) (1) MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SUBSECTION**  
19 **~~(A)(1)(XX) AND (XXI)~~ (A)(1)(XXI) OF THIS SECTION:**

20                   **(I) SERVE A 3-YEAR TERM;**

21                   **(II) MAY SERVE FOR A MAXIMUM OF TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS;**

3           **(3) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF THIS**  
4 **SUBSECTION, ALL MEMBERS SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE GOVERNOR.**

5           **(E) WITH THE CONSENT OF THE COUNCIL, THE CHAIR MAY DESIGNATE**  
6 **ADDITIONAL INDIVIDUALS WITH RELEVANT EXPERTISE TO SERVE ON A COMMITTEE**  
7 **OR TASK FORCE.**

9           **(A) (1) THE COUNCIL MAY ADOPT PROCEDURES NECESSARY TO DO**  
10 **BUSINESS, INCLUDING THE CREATION OF COMMITTEES OR TASK FORCES.**

11           **(2) THE COUNCIL MAY CONSULT WITH STATE AGENCIES TO CARRY**  
12 **OUT THE DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL.**

13           **(3) THE COUNCIL SHALL MEET AT LEAST SIX TIMES A YEAR.**

20 **STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.**

21           **(C) THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION SHALL PROVIDE ONE**  
22 **FULL-TIME PROJECT MANAGER FOR ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATION, AND OTHER**  
23 **STAFF AS NECESSARY TO SUPPORT THE FUNCTIONS OF THE COUNCIL.**

25           **THE COUNCIL SHALL:**

26           **(1) PROMOTE AND ADVOCATE FOR:**

27           **(I) PLANNING, POLICY, WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, AND**  
28 **SERVICES TO ENSURE A COORDINATED, QUALITY SYSTEM OF CARE THAT IS**  
29 **OUTCOME-GUIDED AND THAT INTEGRATES PREVENTION, RECOVERY,**

1 EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICES, AND COST-EFFECTIVE STRATEGIES THAT ENHANCE  
2 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES ACROSS THE STATE; AND

3 (II) A CULTURALLY COMPETENT AND COMPREHENSIVE  
4 APPROACH TO PUBLICLY FUNDED PREVENTION, EARLY INTERVENTION,  
5 TREATMENT AND RECOVERY SERVICES THAT SUPPORT AND FOSTER WELLNESS,  
6 RECOVERY, RESILIENCY, AND HEALTH FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE BEHAVIORAL  
7 HEALTH DISORDERS AND THEIR FAMILY MEMBERS; AND

8 (2) SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN  
9 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL  
10 ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 OF EACH YEAR.

23 federal requirements mandated under P.L. 99-660, may initiate the development of core  
24 service agencies as a mechanism for community planning, management, and financing of  
25 mental health services.

27 10-305 and the part “Part I. Maryland Advisory Council” of Article – Health – General of  
28 the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

29 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 9-2801 through  
30 9-2806 and the subtitle “Subtitle 28. State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council” of Article –  
31 State Government of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.
