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## The Hunger-Free Schools Act of 2015

- FOR the purpose of altering a certain definition for a certain fiscal year years to determine the number of students used to calculate a certain grant for schools that participate in a certain federal program; requiring the Maryland State Department of Education, in collaboration with certain local school systems, to report to certain
- 7 <u>committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date;</u> and generally relating to the compensatory education grant for primary and secondary education.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 6 1. The number of students eligible for free or reduced price 7 meals for the prior fiscal year; or

THE SUM OF THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS IN PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS IDENTIFIED BY DIRECT CERTIFICATION FOR THE PRIOR 17 FISCAL YEAR, PLUS THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS IDENTIFIED BY THE INCOME 18 19 INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE FAMILY TO THE SCHOOL SYSTEM ON AN ALTERNATIVE FORM DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PRIOR FISCAL 20 YEAR, PLUS THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR FREE AND REDUCED PRICE 2122MEALS FROM ANY SCHOOLS NOT PARTICIPATING IN THE COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY 23PROVISION FOR THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR; OR

SUBJECT TO **SUBPARAGRAPH** (III) THIS 25 PARAGRAPH, THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS AT SCHOOLS NOT PARTICIPATING IN THE COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY 26 27 PROVISION FOR THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR, PLUS THE PRODUCT OF THE PERCENTAGE 28 OF STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS AT PARTICIPATING 29 SCHOOLS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR PRIOR TO OPTING INTO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY PROVISION MULTIPLIED 30 31 BY THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR ENROLLMENT.
- (III) FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE CALCULATION UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (II)2B OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE SCHOOLS PARTICIPATING IN THE COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY PROGRAM DURING THE PILOT YEAR MAY USE THE PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS IDENTIFIED FOR FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS DURING THE PILOT YEAR.

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SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1,
2018, the Maryland State Department of Education, in collaboration with any local school
system that opts into the United States Department of Agriculture community eligibility
provision, shall report to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the House
Appropriations Committee, and the House Committee on Ways and Means, in accordance
with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on the impact of this Act on the amount of
State aid provided to local school systems.
