- 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 3 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 4 Article Criminal Law
- 5 11-306.
- 6 (a) A person may not knowingly:
- 7 (1) engage in prostitution or assignation by any means;
- 8 (2) keep, set up, occupy, maintain, or operate a building, structure, or 9 conveyance for prostitution or assignation;
- 10 (3) allow a building, structure, or conveyance owned or under the person's control to be used for prostitution or assignation;
- 12 (4) allow or agree to allow a person into a building, structure, or conveyance 13 for prostitution or assignation; or
- 14 (5) procure or solicit or offer to procure or solicit for prostitution or 15 assignation.
- 16 (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction 17 is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not exceeding \$500 or both.
- 18 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IN A 19 PROSECUTION UNDER THIS SECTION, IT IS AN AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE OF DURESS IF
- 20 THE DEFENDANT COMMITTED THE ACT AS A RESULT OF BEING A VICTIM OF AN ACT
- 21 OF ANOTHER <del>COMMITTED IN VIOLATION OF</del> <u>WHO WAS CHARGED WITH VIOLATING</u>
- 22 THE PROHIBITION AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING UNDER § 11–303 OF THE
- 23 CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE OR UNDER FEDERAL LAW.
- 24 (2) A DEFENDANT MAY NOT ASSERT THE AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE
- 25 PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION UNLESS THE DEFENDANT
- 26 NOTIFIES THE STATE'S ATTORNEY OF THE DEFENDANT'S INTENTION TO ASSERT
- 27 THE DEFENSE AT LEAST 10 DAYS PRIOR TO TRIAL.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 29 October 1, 2015.
