A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Higher Education - College Admissions Outreach Program for High-Achieving Students - Establishment

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the College Admissions Outreach Program for $\mathbf{5}$ High–Achieving Students; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission 6 and the Maryland State Department of Education, in collaboration with certain 7 educational officials, agencies, and organizations, to jointly administer the Program; 8 requiring the Program to provide certain information on the college admissions 9 process to certain students free of charge; requiring the Commission and the Department to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; and generally 10 11 relating to the College Admissions Outreach Program for High-Achieving Students.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

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1 (a) There is a Delegate Howard P. Rawlings Program of Educational Excellence 2 Awards in this State that are awarded under this subtitle.

3 (b) The Program shall consist of the following types of awards:

4 (1) Guaranteed Access Grants that are awarded to the neediest students 5 to ensure that 100 percent of educational costs, as defined by regulations adopted by the 6 Commission, are paid; and

7 (2) Educational Assistance Grants that are awarded to low and moderate 8 income students to assist in paying educational costs, as defined by regulations adopted by 9 the Commission.

(a) Subject to subsection (d) of this section, each recipient of a Delegate HowardP. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award shall:

13 (1) Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate program at an 14 eligible institution or be enrolled in a 2-year associate degree program in which the course 15 work is acceptable for transfer credit for an accredited baccalaureate program in an eligible 16 institution;

- 17 (2) Be a resident of this State;
- 18 (3) Demonstrate to the Office a definite financial need; and
- 19 (4) Accept any other conditions attached to the award.
- 20 (b) Each recipient of a Guaranteed Access Grant shall:

(1) Have attained a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent at the end of the first semester of the senior year in high school and have completed high school or, failing to do so, on the recommendation of the recipient's high school principal, provide evidence satisfactory to the Office of extenuating circumstances;

- 25 (2) Begin college within 1 year of completing high school or, failing to do 26 so, provide evidence satisfactory to the Office of extenuating circumstances;
- 27 (3) Be under the age of 22 years at the time of receiving the first award;

28 (4) Have successfully completed a college preparatory program in high29 school;

30 (5) Enroll in college as a full-time student;

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1 (6) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, have an annual family income 2 below a poverty index determined by the Commission; and

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(7) Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish.

4 (c) To determine the annual family income eligibility of an applicant for a 5 Guaranteed Access Grant, the Office may not consider an amount received by the applicant 6 as an earned income credit under § 32 of the Internal Revenue Code.

7 (d) A student in grade 9 or grade 10 who applies and qualifies for a Guaranteed 8 Access Grant on the basis of financial need as established by the Commission shall 9 prequalify for a Guaranteed Access Grant to be used at the time of enrollment in an 10 institution of higher education by agreeing in writing, as a secondary and undergraduate 11 student, to:

- 12 (1) Satisfy the attendance policy of the applicable school;
- 13 (2) Refrain from substance abuse;
- 14 (3) Provide information required by the Commission or the State Board of15 Education;
- 16 (4) Complete and file on a timely basis applications for federal student aid 17 for each year that the student plans to enroll in postsecondary education;
- 18 (5) Participate in the College Readiness Outreach Program established in 19 § 18–303.1 of this subtitle until the student graduates from high school and matriculates 20 at an institution of higher education; and
- 21 (6) Satisfy any other program requirements set by the Office, the 22 Commission, the State Board of Education, or the State Department of Education.

24 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 25 INDICATED.

26 (2) "ELIGIBLE STUDENT" MEANS A STUDENT WHO:
27 (I) IS IN THE 12TH GRADE AT A HIGH SCHOOL IN THE STATE;
28 (II) IS ACADEMICALLY HIGH ACHIEVING; AND
29 (III) QUALIFIES FOR A GUARANTEED ACCESS GRANT UNDER
30 THIS SUBTITLE.

1 (3) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE COLLEGE ADMISSIONS OUTREACH 2 PROGRAM FOR HIGH-ACHIEVING STUDENTS.

3 (B) THE COMMISSION AND THE DEPARTMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH
4 COUNTY BOARDS OF EDUCATION, COUNTY SUPERINTENDENTS, AND INSTITUTIONS
5 OF HIGHER EDUCATION, SHALL JOINTLY ADMINISTER THE COLLEGE ADMISSIONS
6 OUTREACH PROGRAM FOR HIGH–ACHIEVING STUDENTS.

7 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO ENCOURAGE MORE STUDENTS 8 WHO QUALIFY FOR A GUARANTEED ACCESS GRANT TO ENROLL IN AN INSTITUTION 9 OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT IS A GOOD ACADEMIC AND FINANCIAL FIT FOR THE 10 STUDENT.

11 (D) THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION TO 12 EACH ELIGIBLE STUDENT AT NO COST TO THE STUDENT:

13(1) INFORMATION ON COLLEGE ADMISSIONS AND COLLEGE14APPLICATION FEE WAIVERS; AND

15 (2) MATERIAL ENCOURAGING STUDENTS TO APPLY TO AT LEAST 16 FOUR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION DURING THE STUDENT'S APPLICATION 17 PROCESS.

18 (E) FUNDS FOR THE PROGRAM SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE 19 BUDGET.

20 (F) (1) THE COMMISSION AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT 21 REGULATIONS TO DEFINE A "HIGH–ACHIEVING STUDENT".

22 (2) THE COMMISSION AND THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT ANY 23 OTHER REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
